<b>delight</b>	Take delight in. <i>An experience guaranteed to <b>delight</b> both young and old.</i>
<a href="#"><b>enchant</b></a>	Cast a spell over someone or something; put a hex on someone or something. <i>Isabel was <b>enchanted</b> with the idea.</i>
<b>enrapture</b>	Hold spellbound. <i>Ruth was <b>enraptured</b> by the sleeping child.</i>
<b>enthral</b>	Capture the fascinated attention of. <i>She had been so <b>enthralled</b> by the adventure that she had hardly noticed the cold.</i>
<b>ravish</b>	Fill (someone) with intense delight; enrapture. <i>An angry father who suspects that his daughter has been <b>ravished</b>.</i>
<b>transport</b>	Transport commercially. <i>He was convicted of theft and <b>transported</b>.</i>

## Associations of "Enthrall" (30 Words)

<b>admittance</b>	A measure of electrical conduction, numerically equal to the reciprocal of the impedance. <i>People were unable to gain <b>admittance</b> to the hall.</i>
<b>allure</b>	Dispose or incline or entice to. <i>People for whom gold holds no <b>allure</b>.</i>
<b>appeal</b>	Challenge (a decision). <i><b>Appeal</b> to somebody for help.</i>
<b>attract</b>	Be attractive to. <i>His criticism of the government <b>attracted</b> widespread support.</i>
<b>attraction</b>	An entertainment that is offered to the public. <i>This reform has many <b>attractions</b> for those on the left.</i>
<b>attractive</b>	Having qualities or features which arouse interest. <i>A remarkably <b>attractive</b> young man.</i>
<b>beguile</b>	Trick (someone) into doing something. <i>To <b>beguile</b> some of the time they went to the cinema.</i>
<u><b>cachet</b></u>	The state of being respected or admired; prestige. <i>Special <b>cachets</b> are applied to cards sold at the stands.</i>
<u><b>captivate</b></u>	Attract and hold the interest and attention of; charm. <i>He was <b>captivated</b> by her beauty.</i>
<u><b>charisma</b></u>	Compelling attractiveness or charm that can inspire devotion in others. <i>He has tremendous <b>charisma</b> and stage presence.</i>
<u><b>charm</b></u>	Induce into action by using one's charm. <i>His <b>charm</b> has captivated the media.</i>
<u><b>enchant</b></u>	Cast a spell over someone or something; put a hex on someone or something. <i>Isabel was <b>enchanted</b> with the idea.</i>
<u><b>entrance</b></u>	Attract; cause to be enamored. <i>At their abrupt <b>entrance</b> he rose to his feet.</i>
<u><b>fascinate</b></u>	To render motionless, as with a fixed stare or by arousing terror or awe. <i>I've always been <b>fascinated</b> by computers.</i>
<u><b>gate</b></u>	Control with a valve or other device that functions like a gate. <i>They were opening the <b>gates</b> of their country wide to the enemy.</i>
<b>gateway</b>	An opening that can be closed by a gate. <i>To me a home in the country was a <b>gateway</b> to happiness.</i>
<b>hypnotic</b>	A person under or open to hypnosis. <i><b>Hypnotics</b> may be prescribed.</i>

<b>hypnotist</b>	A person who induces hypnosis. <i>An expert clinician and skilled <b>hypnotist</b>.</i>
<b>hypnotize</b>	Produce a state of hypnosis in (someone). <i>She gazed down <b>hypnotized</b> by the swirling tide.</i>
<u><b>inviting</b></u>	Attractive and tempting. <i>The sea down there looks so <b>inviting</b>.</i>
<u><b>magician</b></u>	A conjuror. <i>He was the <b>magician</b> of the fan belt.</i>
<b>mesmerize</b>	Attract strongly, as if with a magnet. <i>They were <b>mesmerized</b> by his story.</i>
<b>narcissist</b>	A person who has an excessive interest in or admiration of themselves. <i><b>Narcissists</b> preening themselves in front of the mirror.</i>
<u><b>paralyzed</b></u>	Affected with paralysis.
<b>portal</b>	A website or web page providing access or links to other sites. <i>The <b>portals</b> of heaven.</i>
<u><b>seduction</b></u>	Enticing someone astray from right behavior. <i>If <b>seduction</b> doesn't work she can play on his sympathy.</i>
<b>spellbind</b>	To render motionless, as with a fixed stare or by arousing terror or awe. <i>The singer held the audience <b>spellbound</b>.</i>
<u><b>tempting</b></u>	Very pleasantly inviting. <i>A <b>tempting</b> financial offer.</i>
<u><b>trance</b></u>	Put into a trance. <i>She's been <b>tranced</b> and may need waking.</i>
<b>wile</b>	The use of tricks to deceive someone (usually to extract money from them). <i>The gang had played monopoly as they <b>wiled</b> away the hours.</i>
