## Associations of "Enthused" (30 Words)

<b>argue</b>	Have an argument about something. <i>The evidence <b>argues</b> for your claim.</i>
<a href="#"><u>argument</u></a>	An independent variable associated with a function or proposition and determining its value For example in the expression $y = F(x)$ the arguments of the function $F$ are $x$ and $x$ and the value is $y$ . <i>It was a strong <b>argument</b> that his hypothesis was true.</i>
<b>bicker</b>	A quarrel about petty points. <i>Couples who <b>bicker</b> over who gets what from the divorce.</i>
<a href="#"><u>contention</u></a>	A contentious speech act; a dispute where there is strong disagreement. <i>Freud's <b>contention</b> that all dreams were wish fulfilment.</i>
<a href="#"><u>contentious</u></a>	Relating to or involving differences between contending parties. <i>A <b>contentious</b> issue.</i>
<b>contentiousness</b>	An inclination to be quarrelsome and contentious.
<b>contributor</b>	A writer whose work is published in a newspaper or magazine or as part of a book. <i>Hunt was the largest <b>contributor</b> of hymns to these collections.</i>
<a href="#"><u>controversial</u></a>	Marked by or capable of arousing controversy. <i>A <b>controversial</b> decision on affirmative action.</i>
<a href="#"><u>controversy</u></a>	Prolonged public disagreement or heated discussion. <i>The announcement ended a protracted <b>controversy</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>debatable</u></a>	Open to discussion or argument. <i>It is <b>debatable</b> whether the country is coming out of recession.</i>
<b>debate</b>	The formal presentation of a stated proposition and the opposition to it (usually followed by a vote). <i>MPs <b>debated</b> the issue in the Commons.</i>
<b>declamatory</b>	Ostentatiously lofty in style. <i>A long <b>declamatory</b> speech.</i>

<b><u>discourse</u></b>	Written or spoken communication or debate. <i>A <b>discourse</b> on critical theory.</i>
<b>discussion</b>	The action or process of talking about something in order to reach a decision or to exchange ideas. <i>See Appendix One for a more detailed <b>discussion</b>.</i>
<b>disproof</b>	A set of facts that prove that something is untrue. <i>Rex was living <b>disproof</b> of the youth preserving powers imputed to life in the college.</i>
<b>disputable</b>	Not established as a fact, and so open to question or debate. <i>Whether it can be described as art criticism may be <b>disputable</b>.</i>
<b>disputation</b>	Debate or argument. <i>Promoting consensus rather than <b>disputation</b>.</i>
<b>dispute</b>	A disagreement between management and employees that leads to industrial action. <i>The estate <b>disputes</b> that it is responsible for the embankment.</i>
<b>forum</b>	A public meeting or assembly for open discussion. <i>We hope these pages act as a <b>forum</b> for debate.</i>
<b>gainsay</b>	Deny or contradict (a fact or statement). <i>None could <b>gainsay</b> her.</i>
<b>hassel</b>	Norwegian chemist noted for his research on organic molecules (1897-1981).
<b><u>heated</u></b>	Made warm or hot het is a dialectal variant of heated. <i>A <b>heated</b> argument.</i>
<b>impugn</b>	Attack as false or wrong. <i>The father does not <b>impugn</b> her capacity as a good mother.</i>
<b>polemical</b>	Of or involving dispute or controversy. <i>A <b>polemical</b> essay.</i>
<b><u>quarrel</u></b>	An arrow that is shot from a crossbow; has a head with four edges. <i>She made the mistake of picking a <b>quarrel</b> with John.</i>
<b>rebut</b>	Overthrow by argument, evidence, or proof. <i>He had to <b>rebut</b> charges of acting for the convenience of his political friends.</i>
<b><u>rebuttal</u></b>	(law) a pleading by the defendant in reply to a plaintiff's surrejoinder.
<b>refutable</b>	Able to be refuted.
<b><u>refute</u></b>	Overthrow by argument, evidence, or proof. <i>These claims have not been convincingly <b>refuted</b>.</i>

**wrangle**

An instance of intense argument (as in bargaining).  
*The horses were **wrangled** early.*
