The formal presentation of a stated proposition and the opposition to it

MPs **debate**d the issue in the Commons.

Ostentatiously lofty in style.

declamatoryA long **declamatory** speech.



discourse Written or spoken communication or debate.

A **discourse** on critical theory.

The action or process of talking about something in order to reach a

discussion decision or to exchange ideas.

disputation Debate or argument.

Promoting consensus rather than disputation.

A disagreement between management and employees that leads to

dispute industrial action.

The estate **dispute**s that it is responsible for the embankment.

forum A public meeting or assembly for open discussion.

We hope these pages act as a **forum** for debate.

gainsayDeny or contradict (a fact or statement.

None could **gainsay** her.

hassel

Norwegian chemist noted for his research on organic molecules

(1897-1981.

heated Made warm or hot het is a dialectal variant of heated.

A **heated** argument.

. Attack as false or wrong.

impugn

The father does not impugn her capacity as a good mother.

Of or involving dispute or controversy.

polemical

A polemical essay.

An arrow that is shot from a crossbow; has a head with four edges.

She made the mistake of picking a **quarrel** with John.

Overthrow by argument, evidence, or proof.

rebut He had to **rebut** charges of acting for the convenience of his political

friends.

rebuttal (law) a pleading by the defendant in reply to a plaintiff's surrejoinder.

refutable Able to be refuted.

refute Overthrow by argument, evidence, or proof.

These claims have not been convincingly **refute**d.
