<a href="#">able</a>	Having considerable skill proficiency or intelligence. <i>She was <b>able</b> to program her computer.</i>
<b>acceptable</b>	Moderately good; satisfactory. <i>An <b>acceptable</b> substitute for champagne.</i>
<b>allow</b>	Allow or plan for a certain possibility concede the truth or validity of something. <i>Income rose by 11 per cent <b>allowing</b> for inflation.</i>
<b>allowable</b>	Allowed, especially within a set of regulations; permissible. <i>The loan deal has been extended to the maximum <b>allowable</b> three months.</i>
<b>applicant</b>	A person who makes a formal application for something, especially a job. <i><b>Applicants</b> for the degree course.</i>
<b>authorize</b>	Grant authorization or clearance for. <i>The rock star never <b>authorized</b> this slanderous biography.</i>
<b>certification</b>	The act of certifying or bestowing a franchise on. <i>A fundamental requirement for organic <b>certification</b>.</i>
<b>characterize</b>	Be characteristic of. <i>She <b>characterized</b> the period as the decade of revolution.</i>
<b>decriminalize</b>	Make legal. <i>A battle to <b>decriminalize</b> cannabis.</i>
<b>delegate</b>	Send or authorize (someone) to do something as a representative. <i>Edward was <b>delegated</b> to meet new arrivals.</i>
<a href="#">empower</a>	Give (someone) the authority or power to do something. <i>Movements to <b>empower</b> the poor.</i>
<b>enable</b>	Make (a device or system) operational; activate. <i>The Department is leading the effort to <b>enable</b> a smooth and timely transition.</i>

<b>endue</b>	Give qualities or abilities to. <i>Our sight would be <b>endued</b> with a far greater sharpness.</i>
<b><u>ennoble</u></b>	Give a title to someone; make someone a member of the nobility. <i>The theatre is a moral instrument to <b>ennoble</b> the mind.</i>
<b><u>exam</u></b>	A set of questions or exercises evaluating skill or knowledge. <i><b>Exam</b> results.</i>
<b><u>exclusion</u></b>	An item or eventuality specifically not covered by an insurance policy or other contract. <i><b>Exclusions</b> can be added to your policy.</i>
<b>exemption</b>	Immunity from an obligation or duty. <i>Vehicles that may qualify for <b>exemption</b> from tax.</i>
<b>fit</b>	The manner in which something fits. <i>They <b>fitted</b> smoke alarms to their home.</i>
<b><u>invest</u></b>	Make an investment. <i>He stands before you <b>invested</b> in the full canonicals of his calling.</i>
<b>legalize</b>	Make legal. <i>The Swiss parliament <b>legalized</b> cannabis.</i>
<b><u>let</u></b>	Used to express an assumption upon which a theory or calculation is to be based. <i>About 50 people were <b>let</b> into the hearing.</i>
<b>permissible</b>	Permitted; allowed. <i>A kind of speculation that was <b>permissible</b> in cosmology but inadmissible in medicine.</i>
<b><u>permit</u></b>	An official document giving someone authorization to do something. <i>The country is not ready to <b>permit</b> any rice imports.</i>
<b>privilege</b>	Grant a privilege or privileges to. <i>English inheritance law <b>privileged</b> the eldest son.</i>
<b><u>qualify</u></b>	Specify as a condition or requirement in a contract or agreement; make an express demand or provision in an agreement. <i>The training necessary to <b>qualify</b> as a solicitor.</i>
<b>ratify</b>	Sign or give formal consent to (a treaty, contract, or agreement), making it officially valid. <i>Both countries were due to <b>ratify</b> the treaty by the end of the year.</i>
<b>thereby</b>	By that means or because of that. <i>Students perform in hospitals <b>thereby</b> gaining a deeper awareness of the therapeutic power of music.</i>
<b>unobjectionable</b>	Not objectionable; acceptable. <i>The bail conditions were <b>unobjectionable</b> as far as he was concerned.</i>

**viscount**

A son or younger brother or a count.

**warrant**

A document issued by a legal or government official authorizing the police or another body to make an arrest, search premises, or carry out some other action relating to the administration of justice.
