## **Entitlement as a Noun**

## Definitions of "Entitlement" as a noun

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "entitlement" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- The belief that one is inherently deserving of privileges or special treatment.
- The amount to which a person has a right.
- A government scheme that provides benefits to any individual meeting certain eligibility requirements.
- *Right granted by law or contract (especially a right to benefits.*
- The fact of having a right to something.





## Synonyms of "Entitlement" as a noun (12 Words)

allocation	(computer science) the assignment of particular areas of a magnetic disk to particular data or instructions. More efficient <b>allocation</b> of resources.
allotment	A share set aside for a specific purpose. <i>The <b>allotment</b> of equity securities.</i>
<u>allowance</u>	A deduction in the weight that a horse is required to carry in a race. My weekly <b>allowance</b> of two eggs.
claim	A demand or request for something considered one's due. <i>His <b>claim</b> asked for damages.</i>
grant	A right or privilege that has been granted. We had to recommend the <b>grant</b> or refusal of broadcasting licences.
licence	A legal document giving official permission to do something. A subsidiary company manufactured cranes under <b>licence</b> from a Norwegian firm.



limit	Final or latest limiting point. The 10 minute <b>limit</b> on speeches.
prerogative	A right or privilege exclusive to a particular individual or class. Suffrage was the <b>prerogative</b> of white adult males.
quota	(in the Anglican Church) the proportion of the funds of a parish contributed to the finances of the diocese. The country may be exceeding its OPEC <b>quota</b> of 1 100 000 barrels of oil per day.
ration	A fixed amount of a commodity officially allowed to each person during a time of shortage, as in wartime. <i>Their emergency <b>rations</b> ran out.</i>
right	A road or entrance on the right. You re quite within your <b>right</b> s to ask for your money back.
<u>title</u>	(usually plural) written material introduced into a movie or TV show to give credits or represent dialogue or explain an action. <i>He held the <b>title</b> for two years.</i>





## Usage Examples of "Entitlement" as a noun

- Her annual leave entitlement.
- Social Security, Medicare, and other entitlements are going broke.
- Full entitlement to fees and maintenance should be offered.
- No wonder your kids have a sense of entitlement.
- This entitlement mentality is completely out of control.
