Entitlement as a Noun

Definitions of "Entitlement" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “entitlement” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The belief that one is inherently deserving of privileges or special treatment.*
- *The amount to which a person has a right.*
- *A government scheme that provides benefits to any individual meeting certain eligibility requirements.*
- *Right granted by law or contract (especially a right to benefits).*
- *The fact of having a right to something.*



Synonyms of "Entitlement" as a noun (12 Words)

allocation	(computer science) the assignment of particular areas of a magnetic disk to particular data or instructions. <i>More efficient allocation of resources.</i>
allotment	A share set aside for a specific purpose. <i>The allotment of equity securities.</i>
<u>allowance</u>	A deduction in the weight that a horse is required to carry in a race. <i>My weekly allowance of two eggs.</i>
claim	A demand or request for something considered one's due. <i>His claim asked for damages.</i>
grant	A right or privilege that has been granted. <i>We had to recommend the grant or refusal of broadcasting licences.</i>
licence	A legal document giving official permission to do something. <i>A subsidiary company manufactured cranes under licence from a Norwegian firm.</i>

limit	Final or latest limiting point. <i>The 10 minute limit on speeches.</i>
<u>prerogative</u>	A right or privilege exclusive to a particular individual or class. <i>Suffrage was the prerogative of white adult males.</i> (in the Anglican Church) the proportion of the funds of a parish contributed to the finances of the diocese.
quota	<i>The country may be exceeding its OPEC quota of 1 100 000 barrels of oil per day.</i>
ration	A fixed amount of a commodity officially allowed to each person during a time of shortage, as in wartime. <i>Their emergency rations ran out.</i>
right	A road or entrance on the right. <i>You re quite within your rights to ask for your money back.</i>
<u>title</u>	(usually plural) written material introduced into a movie or TV show to give credits or represent dialogue or explain an action. <i>He held the title for two years.</i>



Usage Examples of "Entitlement" as a noun

- *Her annual leave entitlement.*
- *Social Security, Medicare, and other entitlements are going broke.*
- *Full entitlement to fees and maintenance should be offered.*
- *No wonder your kids have a sense of entitlement.*
- *This entitlement mentality is completely out of control.*
- *Entitlements make up the major part of the federal budget.*
