Definitions of "Entitlement" as a noun

- The belief that one is inherently deserving of privileges or special treatment.
- The amount to which a person has a right.
- A government scheme that provides benefits to any individual meeting certain eligibility requirements.
- Right granted by law or contract (especially a right to benefits.
- The fact of having a right to something.

allotment A share set aside for a specific purpose.

claim A demand or request for something considered one's due.

grant

A right or privilege that has been granted.

We had to recommend the grant or refusal of broadcasting licences.

A legal document giving official permission to do something.

licence A subsidiary company manufactured cranes under **licence** from a Norwegian

firm.



limit Final or latest limiting point.

The 10 minute **limit** on speeches.

prerogative A right or privilege exclusive to a particular individual or class.

Suffrage was the **prerogative** of white adult males.

(in the Anglican Church) the proportion of the funds of a parish contributed to

the finances of the diocese.

quota

The country may be exceeding its OPEC quota of 1 100 000 barrels of oil per

day.

A fixed amount of a commodity officially allowed to each person during a time

ration of shortage, as in wartime.

Their emergency **ration**s ran out.

right A road or entrance on the right.

You re quite within your **right**s to ask for your money back.

(usually plural) written material introduced into a movie or TV show to give

<u>title</u> credits or represent dialogue or explain an action.

He held the **title** for two years.
