Entitlement as a Noun

Definitions of "Entitlement" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “entitlement” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The belief that one is inherently deserving of privileges or special treatment.*
- *The amount to which a person has a right.*
- *A government scheme that provides benefits to any individual meeting certain eligibility requirements.*
- *Right granted by law or contract (especially a right to benefits).*
- *The fact of having a right to something.*



Synonyms of "Entitlement" as a noun (12 Words)

- allocation** (computer science) the assignment of particular areas of a magnetic disk to particular data or instructions.
*More efficient **allocation** of resources.*
- allotment** A share set aside for a specific purpose.
*The **allotment** of equity securities.*
- allowance** A deduction in the weight that a horse is required to carry in a race.
*My weekly **allowance** of two eggs.*
- claim** A demand or request for something considered one's due.
*His **claim** asked for damages.*
- grant** A right or privilege that has been granted.
*We had to recommend the **grant** or refusal of broadcasting licences.*
- licence** A legal document giving official permission to do something.
*A subsidiary company manufactured cranes under **licence** from a Norwegian firm.*

- limit** Final or latest limiting point.
*The 10 minute **limit** on speeches.*
- prerogative** A right or privilege exclusive to a particular individual or class.
*Suffrage was the **prerogative** of white adult males.*
(in the Anglican Church) the proportion of the funds of a parish contributed to the finances of the diocese.
- quota** *The country may be exceeding its OPEC **quota** of 1 100 000 barrels of oil per day.*
- ration** A fixed amount of a commodity officially allowed to each person during a time of shortage, as in wartime.
*Their emergency **rations** ran out.*
- right** A road or entrance on the right.
*You re quite within your **rights** to ask for your money back.*
- title** (usually plural) written material introduced into a movie or TV show to give credits or represent dialogue or explain an action.
*He held the **title** for two years.*



Usage Examples of "Entitlement" as a noun

- *Her annual leave entitlement.*
- *Social Security, Medicare, and other entitlements are going broke.*
- *Full entitlement to fees and maintenance should be offered.*
- *No wonder your kids have a sense of entitlement.*
- *This entitlement mentality is completely out of control.*
- *Entitlements make up the major part of the federal budget.*
