### Definitions of "Entrenched" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “entrenched” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Dug in.*
- *Established firmly and securely.*
- *(of an attitude, habit, or belief) firmly established and difficult or unlikely to change; ingrained.*

### Synonyms of "Entrenched" as an adjective (3 Words)

<b>established</b>	Brought about or set up or accepted especially long established. <i>The <b>established</b> Church.</i>
<b>ingrained</b>	(of a habit, belief, or attitude) firmly fixed or established; difficult to change. <i>The <b>ingrained</b> dirt on the flaking paintwork.</i>
<b>well established</b>	In good health especially after having suffered illness or injury.

### Usage Examples of "Entrenched" as an adjective

- *The entrenched power of the nobility.*
- *An entrenched resistance to change.*

## Associations of "Entrenched" (30 Words)

<b>accepted</b>	Generally approved or compelling recognition. <i>The <b>accepted</b> consensus within the church.</i>
<b>assertive</b>	Aggressively self-assured. <i>An energetic <b>assertive</b> boy who was always ready to argue.</i>
<b>assured</b>	Protected against discontinuance or change. <i>A tiny but <b>assured</b> income.</i>
<b>certain</b>	Certain to occur destined or inevitable. <i>To a <b>certain</b> degree.</i>
<b>certainly</b>	Used to express complete agreement with something that has just been said. <i>The prestigious address <b>certainly</b> adds to the firm's appeal.</i>
<b>certitude</b>	Something that someone firmly believes is true. <i>The question may never be answered with <b>certitude</b>.</i>
<b>conclusive</b>	(of evidence or argument) having or likely to have the effect of proving a case; decisive. <i>The findings were by no means <b>conclusive</b>.</i>
<b>convinced</b>	Completely certain about something. <i>She was not entirely <b>convinced</b> of the soundness of his motives.</i>
<b>decided</b>	Recognizable; marked. <i>You could never talk him round he was very <b>decided</b>.</i>
<b>definite</b>	Clear or undeniable (used for emphasis). <i>You're very <b>definite</b> about that.</i>
<b>dependable</b>	Worthy of reliance or trust. <i>The most valuable and <b>dependable</b> of America's allies.</i>
<b>determined</b>	Having been learned or found or determined especially by investigation. <i>Helen was a <b>determined</b> little girl.</i>
<b>entrench</b>	Establish (someone) in a position of great strength or security. <i>Concessions which <b>entrenched</b> so deeply on the honour and dignity of the Crown.</i>
<b>established</b>	Brought about or set up or accepted especially long established. <i>The <b>established</b> Church.</i>
<b>fasten</b>	Become fixed or fastened. <i>A blue nightie that <b>fastens</b> down the back.</i>
<b>firmly</b>	With little possibility of movement; securely. <i>Stop the bleeding by pressing <b>firmly</b>.</i>

<b>formally</b>	In accordance with convention or etiquette. <i><b>Formally</b> complex types of text.</i>
<b>fortified</b>	(of a place) provided with defensive works as protection against attack. <i>Many <b>fortified</b> wines are sweet.</i>
<b>ingrained</b>	Deeply rooted; firmly fixed or held. <i>His deeply <b>ingrained</b> Catholic convictions.</i>
<b>ordained</b>	Fixed or established especially by order or command. <i>An <b>ordained</b> priest.</i>
<b>ossified</b>	Having become rigid or fixed in attitude or position. <i>An <b>ossified</b> bureaucratic system.</i>
<b>prescribed</b>	Fixed or established especially by order or command. <i>In <b>prescribed</b> order.</i>
<b>proven</b>	Established beyond doubt. <i>A <b>proven</b> liar.</i>
<b>securely</b>	In a fixed or stable manner. <i>Prisoners held <b>securely</b> behind bars.</i>
<b>solidly</b>	Without any spaces or gaps. <i>The workers were <b>solidly</b> united.</i>
<b>stoutly</b>	In a resolute manner. <i>The houses are built <b>stoutly</b> of granite.</i>
<b>strongly</b>	With great power or strength. <i>She started out swimming <b>strongly</b>.</i>
<b>sure</b>	Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely. <i>A <b>sure</b> or true sign of one's commitment.</i>
<b>tested</b>	Tested and proved to be reliable. <i>A <b>tested</b> method.</i>
<b>tightly</b>	In a disciplined or well coordinated manner. <i>The government <b>tightly</b> controlled the movement of money.</i>
