- The structure within a balloon or non-rigid airship containing the gas.
- A flat paper container with a sealable flap, used to enclose a letter or document.
- The bag containing the gas in a balloon.
- A curve or surface tangent to each of a family of curves or surfaces.
- The outer metal or glass housing of a vacuum tube, electric light, etc.
- A natural covering (as by a fluid.
- Any wrapper or covering.
- A flat (usually rectangular) container for a letter, thin package, etc.


