box	Engage in a boxing match. <i>The royal box was empty.</i>
canopy	Cover with a canopy. <i>They mounted the station steps under the concrete canopy.</i>
carton	The quantity contained in a carton. <i>A carton of milk.</i>
clamshell	Something such as a mobile phone with hinged parts that open and shut like a clamshell. <i>A clamshell cellular phone.</i>
comprise	Include or contain; have as a component. <i>The land he conquered comprised several provinces.</i>
confine	Restrict or confine. <i>Within the confines of the hall escape was difficult.</i>
convolve	Roll or coil together; entwine.
cover	Provide with a covering or cause to be covered. <i>He pulled the covers over his head and went to sleep.</i>
encase	Enclose in, or as if in, a case. <i>Each was encased in a plastic shrink wrap.</i>
encircle	Form or draw a circle around. <i>The town is encircled by fortified walls.</i>
enclose	Enclose or enfold completely with or as if with a covering. <i>Darkness enclosed him.</i>
encompass	Include in scope; include as part of something broader; have as one's sphere or territory. <i>An act designed to encompass the death of the king.</i>

<u>engulf</u>	(of a natural force) sweep over (something) so as to surround or cover it completely. <i>The bright light engulfed him completely.</i>
environ	Surround; enclose. <i>The stone circle was enviromed by an expanse of peat soil.</i>
filled	Of purchase orders that have been filled. <i>Theirs was a house filled with laughter.</i>
hermetically	In a way that is completely airtight. <i>A hermetically closed society.</i>
include	Comprise or contain as part of a whole. <i>I include you in the list of culprits.</i>
included	Enclosed in the same envelope or package. <i>Service tax included.</i>
inclusion	A body or particle of distinct composition embedded in a rock or other material. <i>The exhibition features such inclusions as the study of the little girl.</i>
incorporate	Constitute (a company, city, or other organization) as a legal corporation. <i>Incorporate this document with those pertaining to the same case.</i>
<u>involve</u>	Require as useful, just, or proper. <i>My job involves a lot of travelling.</i>
packaging	The presentation of a person or thing in an advantageous way. <i>They specialized in food packaging.</i>
seal	Close with or as if with a seal. <i>She sealed the letter with hot wax.</i>
<u>shroud</u>	Wrap or dress a body in a shroud for burial. <i>They operate behind a shroud of secrecy.</i>
subsume	Include or absorb (something) in something else. <i>Most of these phenomena can be subsumed under two broad categories.</i>
<u>surround</u>	Surround with a wall in order to fortify. <i>The hotel is surrounded by its own gardens.</i>
swathe	A strip left clear by the passage of a mowing machine or scythe. <i>Vast swathes of countryside.</i>
unopened	Not opened. <i>Unopened Christmas presents.</i>
<u>wrap</u>	Cloak that is folded or wrapped around a person. <i>Words are wrapped to the next line if they are too long.</i>

wrapping

The covering (usually paper or cellophane) in which something is wrapped.
*She took the cellophane **wrapping** off the box.*
