Definitions of "Envoy" as a noun

- Someone sent on a mission to represent the interests of someone else.
- A minister plenipotentiary, ranking below ambassador and above chargé d'affaires.
- A messenger or representative, especially one on a diplomatic mission.
- A diplomat having less authority than an ambassador.
- A brief stanza concluding certain forms of poetry.
