Definitions of "Envoy" as a noun

- *Someone sent on a mission to represent the interests of someone else.*
- *A minister plenipotentiary, ranking below ambassador and above chargé d'affaires.*
- *A messenger or representative, especially one on a diplomatic mission.*
- *A diplomat having less authority than an ambassador.*
- *A brief stanza concluding certain forms of poetry.*

Synonyms of "Envoy" as a noun (28 Words)

agent	Any agent or representative of a federal agency or bureau. <i>In the event of illness a durable power of attorney enabled her nephew to act as her agent.</i>
ambassador	An informal representative. <i>An ambassador of good will.</i>

attaché	A shallow and rectangular briefcase.
broker	A person who buys and sells goods or assets for others. <i>The centralized lenders operate through brokers.</i>
chargé d'affaires	The official temporarily in charge of a diplomatic mission in the absence of the ambassador.
consul	A diplomat appointed by a government to protect its commercial interests and help its citizens in a foreign country. <i>The British consul in Israel.</i>
courier	A messenger for an underground or espionage organization. <i>He worked as a courier on a package holiday to Majorca.</i>
delegate	A member of a committee. <i>Congress delegates rejected the proposals.</i>
deputy	A person appointed to represent or act on behalf of others. <i>The deputy prime minister.</i>
diplomat	A person who can deal with others in a sensitive and tactful way.
<u>emissary</u>	A person sent as a diplomatic representative on a special mission.
envoi	A short stanza concluding a ballade.
envoy extraordinary	A brief stanza concluding certain forms of poetry.
intermediary	A negotiator who acts as a link between parties. <i>Negotiations took place through an intermediary.</i>
legate	A member of a legation. <i>A papal legate arrived in France on a peacemaking mission.</i>
<u>liaison</u>	A person who acts as a link to assist communication or cooperation between people. <i>He s our liaison with a number of interested parties.</i>
<u>mediator</u>	A negotiator who acts as a link between parties. <i>The government appointed a mediator to assist in finding a resolution to the dispute.</i>
minister plenipotentiary	A diplomat representing one government to another; ranks below ambassador.
mouthpiece	A person or organization who speaks on behalf of another person or organization. <i>He yanked out his brother s mouthpiece so he could breathe through all the blood.</i>

negotiator	Someone who negotiates (confers with others in order to reach a settlement). <i>A hostage negotiator.</i>
plenipotentiary	A person, especially a diplomat, invested with the full power of independent action on behalf of their government, typically in a foreign country.
proxy	A person authorized to act for another. <i>Britons overseas may register to vote by proxy.</i>
representative	An example of a class or group. <i>A PLO representative attending a meeting in Damascus.</i>
spokesman	A person who makes statements on behalf of a group or individual. <i>A spokesman for Greenpeace.</i>
spokesperson	A spokesman or spokeswoman (used as a neutral alternative). <i>A spokesperson for the Scottish Office.</i>
spokeswoman	A woman who makes statements on behalf of a group or individual. <i>A spokeswoman for the agency said it would not be investigating the case.</i>
stand-in	Someone who takes the place of another (as when things get dangerous or difficult).
surrogate	A substitute, especially a person deputizing for another in a specific role or office. <i>She served as a surrogate for the President on a trip to South America.</i>

Usage Examples of "Envoy" as a noun

- A *peace envoy*.
- The UN *special envoy* to Yugoslavia.

Associations of "Envoy" (30 Words)

<u>abroad</u>	Freely moving about. <i>We usually go abroad for a week in May.</i>
<u>ambassador</u>	An accredited diplomat sent by a state as its permanent representative in a foreign country. <i>An ambassador of good will.</i>

calmness	An absence of strong winds or rain. <i>She exuded calmness and good humour.</i>
composure	The state or feeling of being calm and in control of oneself. <i>She was struggling to regain her composure.</i>
consul	Any of the three chief magistrates of the first French republic (1799-1804). <i>The British consul in Israel.</i>
consulate	The system of government by consuls in ancient Rome. <i>He called at the consulate in Palestine to pick up a visa.</i>
country	The people who live in a nation or country. <i>The country's largest manufacturer.</i>
diplomat	A person who deals tactfully with others.
diplomatic	Having or showing an ability to deal with people in a sensitive and tactful way. <i>He tried his best to be diplomatic.</i>
embassy	The staff working in an embassy. <i>The Chilean embassy in Moscow.</i>
emissary	Someone sent on a mission to represent the interests of someone else.
foreign	Dealing with or relating to other countries. <i>Crime and brutality are foreign to our nature.</i>
mediation	A negotiation to resolve differences that is conducted by some impartial party. <i>They are offering sacrifice and mediation between God and man.</i>
messenger	Send a document or package by messenger. <i>Could you have it messengered over to me.</i>
nation	The people who live in a nation or country. <i>The Shawnee nation.</i>
negotiate	Convert (a cheque) into cash or notes. <i>They refused to negotiate with the rebels.</i>
nonviolence	Peaceful resistance to a government by fasting or refusing to cooperate.
official	Given official status as a national or state institution. <i>The golfer asked for an official who could give him a ruling.</i>
pacific	Relating to or bordering the Pacific Ocean. <i>A pacific gesture.</i>
pacification	Actions taken by a government to defeat insurgency. <i>A wonderful skill in the pacification of crying infants.</i>

peace	A treaty agreeing peace between warring states. <i>Peace came on November 11th.</i>
plenipotentiary	A diplomat who is fully authorized to represent his or her government. <i>A minister plenipotentiary.</i>
rapprochement	(especially in international affairs) an establishment or resumption of harmonious relations. <i>There were signs of a growing rapprochement between the two countries.</i>
reconcilable	Capable of being reconciled. <i>Her way of thinking is reconcilable with mine.</i>
reconciliation	The action of making one view or belief compatible with another. <i>Any possibility of reconciliation between such clearly opposed positions.</i>
representative	Being or characteristic of government by representation in which citizens exercise power through elected officers and representatives. <i>Fossil representatives of lampreys and hagfishes.</i>
<u>serenity</u>	A disposition free from stress or emotion. <i>An oasis of serenity amidst the bustling city.</i>
<u>silent</u>	Saying or recording nothing on a particular subject. <i>She fell silent for a moment.</i>
<u>symbol</u>	Symbolize. <i>The Star of David the Jewish symbol.</i>
<u>tacit</u>	Implied by or inferred from actions or statements. <i>Your silence may be taken to mean tacit agreement.</i>
