### Definitions of "Envoy" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “envoy” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *Someone sent on a mission to represent the interests of someone else.*
- *A minister plenipotentiary, ranking below ambassador and above chargé d'affaires.*
- *A messenger or representative, especially one on a diplomatic mission.*
- *A diplomat having less authority than an ambassador.*
- *A brief stanza concluding certain forms of poetry.*

### Synonyms of "Envoy" as a noun (28 Words)

<b>agent</b>	Any agent or representative of a federal agency or bureau. <i>In the event of illness a durable power of attorney enabled her nephew to act as her <b>agent</b>.</i>
<a href="#">ambassador</a>	An informal representative. <i>An <b>ambassador</b> of good will.</i>

<b>attaché</b>	A shallow and rectangular briefcase.
<b>broker</b>	A person who buys and sells goods or assets for others. <i>The centralized lenders operate through <b>brokers</b>.</i>
<b>chargé d'affaires</b>	The official temporarily in charge of a diplomatic mission in the absence of the ambassador.
<b>consul</b>	A diplomat appointed by a government to protect its commercial interests and help its citizens in a foreign country. <i>The British <b>consul</b> in Israel.</i>
<b>courier</b>	A messenger for an underground or espionage organization. <i>He worked as a <b>courier</b> on a package holiday to Majorca.</i>
<b>delegate</b>	A member of a committee. <i>Congress <b>delegates</b> rejected the proposals.</i>
<b>deputy</b>	A person appointed to represent or act on behalf of others. <i>The <b>deputy</b> prime minister.</i>
<b>diplomat</b>	A person who can deal with others in a sensitive and tactful way.
<u><a href="#">emissary</a></u>	A person sent as a diplomatic representative on a special mission.
<b>envoi</b>	A short stanza concluding a ballade.
<b>envoy extraordinary</b>	A brief stanza concluding certain forms of poetry.
<b>intermediary</b>	A negotiator who acts as a link between parties. <i>Negotiations took place through an <b>intermediary</b>.</i>
<b>legate</b>	A member of a legation. <i>A papal <b>legate</b> arrived in France on a peacemaking mission.</i>
<u><a href="#">liaison</a></u>	A person who acts as a link to assist communication or cooperation between people. <i>He s our <b>liaison</b> with a number of interested parties.</i>
<u><a href="#">mediator</a></u>	A negotiator who acts as a link between parties. <i>The government appointed a <b>mediator</b> to assist in finding a resolution to the dispute.</i>
<b>minister plenipotentiary</b>	A diplomat representing one government to another; ranks below ambassador.
<b>mouthpiece</b>	A person or organization who speaks on behalf of another person or organization. <i>He yanked out his brother s <b>mouthpiece</b> so he could breathe through all the blood.</i>

<b>negotiator</b>	Someone who negotiates (confers with others in order to reach a settlement). <i>A hostage <b>negotiator</b>.</i>
<b>plenipotentiary</b>	A person, especially a diplomat, invested with the full power of independent action on behalf of their government, typically in a foreign country.
<b>proxy</b>	A person authorized to act for another. <i>Britons overseas may register to vote by <b>proxy</b>.</i>
<b>representative</b>	An example of a class or group. <i>A PLO <b>representative</b> attending a meeting in Damascus.</i>
<b>spokesman</b>	A person who makes statements on behalf of a group or individual. <i>A <b>spokesman</b> for Greenpeace.</i>
<b>spokesperson</b>	A spokesman or spokeswoman (used as a neutral alternative). <i>A <b>spokesperson</b> for the Scottish Office.</i>
<b>spokeswoman</b>	A woman who makes statements on behalf of a group or individual. <i>A <b>spokeswoman</b> for the agency said it would not be investigating the case.</i>
<b>stand-in</b>	Someone who takes the place of another (as when things get dangerous or difficult).
<b>surrogate</b>	A substitute, especially a person deputizing for another in a specific role or office. <i>She served as a <b>surrogate</b> for the President on a trip to South America.</i>

## Usage Examples of "Envoy" as a noun

## Associations of "Envoy" (30 Words)

<a href="#"><u>abroad</u></a>	Freely moving about. <i>We usually go <b>abroad</b> for a week in May.</i>
<a href="#"><u>ambassador</u></a>	An accredited diplomat sent by a state as its permanent representative in a foreign country. <i>An <b>ambassador</b> of good will.</i>

<b>calmness</b>	An absence of strong winds or rain. <i>She exuded <b>calmness</b> and good humour.</i>
<b>composure</b>	The state or feeling of being calm and in control of oneself. <i>She was struggling to regain her <b>composure</b>.</i>
<b>consul</b>	Any of the three chief magistrates of the first French republic (1799-1804). <i>The British <b>consul</b> in Israel.</i>
<b>consulate</b>	The system of government by consuls in ancient Rome. <i>He called at the <b>consulate</b> in Palestine to pick up a visa.</i>
<b>country</b>	The people who live in a nation or country. <i>The <b>country</b>'s largest manufacturer.</i>
<b>diplomat</b>	A person who deals tactfully with others.
<b>diplomatic</b>	Having or showing an ability to deal with people in a sensitive and tactful way. <i>He tried his best to be <b>diplomatic</b>.</i>
<b>embassy</b>	The staff working in an embassy. <i>The Chilean <b>embassy</b> in Moscow.</i>
<b>emissary</b>	Someone sent on a mission to represent the interests of someone else.
<b>foreign</b>	Dealing with or relating to other countries. <i>Crime and brutality are <b>foreign</b> to our nature.</i>
<b>mediation</b>	A negotiation to resolve differences that is conducted by some impartial party. <i>They are offering sacrifice and <b>mediation</b> between God and man.</i>
<b>messenger</b>	Send a document or package by messenger. <i>Could you have it <b>messengered</b> over to me.</i>
<b>nation</b>	The people who live in a nation or country. <i>The Shawnee <b>nation</b>.</i>
<b>negotiate</b>	Convert (a cheque) into cash or notes. <i>They refused to <b>negotiate</b> with the rebels.</i>
<b>nonviolence</b>	Peaceful resistance to a government by fasting or refusing to cooperate.
<b>official</b>	Given official status as a national or state institution. <i>The golfer asked for an <b>official</b> who could give him a ruling.</i>
<b>pacific</b>	Relating to or bordering the Pacific Ocean. <i>A <b>pacific</b> gesture.</i>
<b>pacification</b>	Actions taken by a government to defeat insurgency. <i>A wonderful skill in the <b>pacification</b> of crying infants.</i>

<b>peace</b>	A treaty agreeing peace between warring states. <i><b>Peace</b> came on November 11th.</i>
<b>plenipotentiary</b>	A diplomat who is fully authorized to represent his or her government. <i>A minister <b>plenipotentiary</b>.</i>
<b>rapprochement</b>	(especially in international affairs) an establishment or resumption of harmonious relations. <i>There were signs of a growing <b>rapprochement</b> between the two countries.</i>
<b>reconcilable</b>	Capable of being reconciled. <i>Her way of thinking is <b>reconcilable</b> with mine.</i>
<b>reconciliation</b>	The action of making one view or belief compatible with another. <i>Any possibility of <b>reconciliation</b> between such clearly opposed positions.</i>
<b>representative</b>	Being or characteristic of government by representation in which citizens exercise power through elected officers and representatives. <i>Fossil <b>representatives</b> of lampreys and hagfishes.</i>
<u><a href="#">serenity</a></u>	A disposition free from stress or emotion. <i>An oasis of <b>serenity</b> amidst the bustling city.</i>
<u><a href="#">silent</a></u>	Saying or recording nothing on a particular subject. <i>She fell <b>silent</b> for a moment.</i>
<u><a href="#">symbol</a></u>	Symbolize. <i>The Star of David the Jewish <b>symbol</b>.</i>
<u><a href="#">tacit</a></u>	Implied by or inferred from actions or statements. <i>Your silence may be taken to mean <b>tacit</b> agreement.</i>
