<b>aftershock</b>	A tremor (or one of a series of tremors) occurring after the main shock of an earthquake.
<b>avalanche</b>	Engulf or carry off by an avalanche. <i>We have had an <b>avalanche</b> of applications for the post.</i>
<b>cataclysmic</b>	Severely destructive. <i>A novel about a <b>cataclysmic</b> world war.</i>
<b>disaster</b>	A sudden accident or a natural catastrophe that causes great damage or loss of life. <i>The earthquake was a <b>disaster</b>.</i>
<b>earthquake</b>	Shaking and vibration at the surface of the earth resulting from underground movement along a fault plane or from volcanic activity. <i>Selling the company caused an <b>earthquake</b> among the employees.</i>
<b>geologic</b>	Of or relating to or based on geology. <i><b>Geological</b> formations.</i>
<b>landslide</b>	An overwhelming electoral victory. <i>Roosevelt defeated Hoover in a <b>landslide</b>.</i>
<b>location</b>	A determination of the place where something is. <i>The property is set in a convenient <b>location</b>.</i>
<b>meteorology</b>	The climate and weather of a region. <i>An induction course to learn basic <b>meteorology</b>.</i>
<b>oscillation</b>	A regular periodic variation in value about a mean. <i>The natural <b>oscillation</b> of a spring.</i>
<b>quake</b>	An earthquake. <i>A little <b>quake</b> of delayed shock nudged her.</i>
<b>quiver</b>	A shaky motion. <i>She couldn't help the <b>quiver</b> in her voice.</i>
<b>ripple</b>	A thing resembling a ripple or ripples in appearance or movement. <i>A <b>ripple</b> of laughter ran around the room.</i>
<b>seismic</b>	Of enormous proportions or effect. <i><b>Seismic</b> data show the deep structure of rift systems.</i>
<b>seismograph</b>	A measuring instrument for detecting and measuring the intensity and direction and duration of movements of the ground (as an earthquake).
<b>seismology</b>	The branch of geology that studies earthquakes.
<b>shake</b>	A milkshake. <i>Camera <b>shake</b> causes the image to become blurred.</i>

<b><u>shaking</u></b>	The act of causing something to move up and down (or back and forth) with quick movements. <i>The <b>shaking</b> of his fingers as he lit his pipe.</i>
<b>shiver</b>	An almost pleasurable sensation of fright. <i>They <b>shivered</b> in the damp foggy cold.</i>
<b><u>shudder</u></b>	An act of shuddering. <i>The train <b>shuddered</b> and edged forward.</i>
<b><u>tremble</u></b>	A reflex motion caused by cold or fear or excitement. <i>I <b>tremble</b> to think that we could ever return to conditions like these.</i>
<b>tremor</b>	Undergo a tremor or tremors. <i>A muscle in my jaw <b>tremored</b> uncontrollably.</i>
<b>tremulous</b>	(of the voice) quivering as from weakness or fear. <i>Barbara's voice was <b>tremulous</b>.</i>
<b><u>tsunami</u></b>	A cataclysm resulting from a destructive sea wave caused by an earthquake or volcanic eruption. <i>A <b>tsunami</b> of data pours into the CNBC newsroom every minute of every trading day.</i>
<b>unrepaired</b>	Unserviceable because necessary repairs have not been made.
<b><u>vibration</u></b>	A shaky motion. <i>Powerful <b>vibrations</b> from an earthquake.</i>
<b>volcanic</b>	Relating to or produced by or consisting of volcanoes. <i>Types of <b>volcanic</b> activity.</i>
<b>wavelet</b>	A small wave of water; a ripple.
<b>wobble</b>	An unsteady rocking motion. <i>They <b>wobble</b> around on their bikes.</i>
