Definitions of "Epitaph" as a noun

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "epitaph" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- A summary statement of commemoration for a dead person.
- Something by which a person, time, or event will be remembered.
- A phrase or form of words written in memory of a person who has died, especially as an inscription on a tombstone.
- An inscription on a tombstone or monument in memory of the person buried there.





Synonyms of "Epitaph" as a noun (4 Words)

A mournful poem; a lament for the dead. elegy

funeral oration A ceremony at which a dead person is buried or cremated.

A notice of someone's death; usually includes a short biography. obituary

An **obituary** notice.

bier

Associations of "Epitaph" (30 Words)

A movable frame on which a coffin or a corpse is placed before burial or

cremation or on which they are carried to the grave.

We followed the **bier** to the graveyard.

burial A ceremony at which someone's body is buried; a funeral.

Burial mounds.

bury Dismiss from the mind; stop remembering.

I tried to **bury** these unpleasant memories.

casket. Enclose in a casket.

A small brass **casket** containing four black opals.

A large burial ground, especially one not in a churchyard.

cemeteryA military **cemetery**.

coffin Put a dead body in a coffin.

The young man was **coffin**ed decently.

A cellar or vault or underground burial chamber (especially beneath a

church.

entomb Bury or trap within something.

Many people died most **entomb**ed in collapsed buildings.

epigraph A quotation at the beginning of some piece of writing.

The action of one surface or object rubbing against another.

A lubrication system which reduces **friction**.

funeral A sermon delivered at a funeral.

Her **funeral** had to pass.

gravestone A stone that is used to mark a grave.

hieroglyphic Resembling hieroglyphic writing.

Notebooks filled with illegible **hieroglyphic**s.

inhume Place in a grave or tomb.

No hand his bones shall gather or **inhume**.

inscription A thing inscribed, as on a monument or in a book.

The **inscription** of memorable utterances on durable materials.

inter Place (a corpse) in a grave or tomb, typically with funeral rites.

He was **inter**red with the military honours due to him.

interment The burial of a corpse in a grave or tomb, typically with funeral rites.

The day of **interment**.

lapidary An expert on precious stones and the art of cutting and engraving them.

A **lapidary** statement.



mausoleum A large burial chamber, usually above ground.

The cathedral was built in 1517 as a royal **mausoleum**.

A statement of facts, especially as the basis of a petition.

memorial The Council sent a strongly worded **memorial** to the Chancellor of the

Exchequer.

monumental Relating or belonging to or serving as a monument.

It s been a **monumental** effort.

mortician One whose business is the management of funerals.

mortuary Relating to burial or tombs.

A mortuary temple.

necropolis A cemetery, especially a large one belonging to an ancient city.

plaqueA sticky deposit on teeth in which bacteria proliferate. **Plaque** around gum margins can lead to gingivitis.

quietus Death or something that causes death, regarded as a release from life.

rubbingThe action of rubbing something.

Dab at the stain vigorous **rubbing** could damage the carpet.

sarcophagus A stone coffin, typically adorned with a sculpture or inscription and

associated with the ancient civilizations of Egypt, Rome, and Greece.

A place for the burial of a corpse especially beneath the ground and marked

tomb by a tombstone.

The house was as quiet as a **tomb**.

tombstone Jump into the sea from a cliff or other high point.

His grin exposed his yellowed teeth like a row of **tombstone**s.
