Synonyms of "Epitome" as a noun (18 Words)

<u>abstract</u>	An abstract work of art. An abstract of her speech.
compendium	A collection of concise but detailed information about a particular subject, especially in a book or other publication. A compendium of tools.
<u>digest</u>	A substance or mixture obtained by digestion. A digest of cloned DNA.
embodiment	A tangible or visible form of an idea, quality, or feeling. The embodiment of hope.
<u>image</u>	A personal facade that one presents to the world. I had a sudden image of Sal bringing me breakfast in bed.
<u>incarnation</u>	With reference to reincarnation each of a series of earthly lifetimes. In a previous journalistic incarnation I worked at Westminster.
outline	A line or set of lines enclosing or indicating the shape of an object in a sketch or diagram. An outline of parliamentary procedure.

<u>paradigm</u>	The class of all items that can be substituted into the same position or slot in a grammatical sentence are in paradigmatic relation with one another. <i>Society's paradigm of the ideal woman.</i>
<u>paragon</u>	An ideal instance; a perfect embodiment of a concept. <i>It would have taken a paragon of virtue not to feel viciously jealous.</i>
personification	The attribution of a personal nature or human characteristics to something non-human, or the representation of an abstract quality in human form. <i>She is the personification of optimism.</i>
potted version	Metal or earthenware cooking vessel that is usually round and deep; often has a handle and lid.
precis	A sketchy summary of the main points of an argument or theory.
prototype	The first, original, or typical form of something; an archetype. <i>The construction of bandpass networks from low pass prototypes.</i>
recapitulation	The repetition of an evolutionary or other process during development or growth. <i>His recapitulation of the argument.</i>
résumé	Short descriptive summary (of events).
summary	A brief statement that presents the main points in a concise form. <i>He gave a summary of the conclusions.</i>
<u>summation</u>	The arithmetic operation of summing; calculating the sum of two or more numbers. <i>The summation of four and three gives seven.</i>
<u>synopsis</u>	An outline of the plot of a play, film, or book. <i>A synopsis of the insurance cover provided is set out below.</i>

Associations of "Epitome" (30 Words)

<u>absolute</u>	Not limited by law. <i>Absolute freedom.</i>
advisory	An official announcement or warning. <i>The EC has put forward an advisory maximum figure.</i>
<u>archetype</u>	A very typical example of a certain person or thing. <i>He was the archetype of the old style football club chairman.</i>

<u>chart</u>	Plot a course on a chart. <i>The poems chart his descent into madness.</i>
emulation	Reproduction of the function or action of a different computer, software system, etc. <i>A model worthy of emulation.</i>
example	An occurrence of something. <i>They decided to make an example of him.</i>
<u>exemplar</u>	Something to be imitated. <i>An exemplar of success.</i>
<u>exemplary</u>	(of a punishment) serving as a warning or deterrent. <i>Exemplary sentencing may discourage the violent minority.</i>
herbarium	A room or building housing a herbarium.
ideal	Conforming to an ultimate standard of perfection or excellence embodying an ideal. <i>Tolerance and freedom the liberal ideals.</i>
<u>instance</u>	An example or single occurrence of something. <i>A serious instance of corruption.</i>
lattice	An interlaced structure or pattern resembling a lattice. <i>The lattice of branches above her.</i>
mannequin	A life-size dummy used to display clothes. <i>She was too fat to be a mannequin.</i>
model	Plan or create according to a model or models. <i>The body of the woman to the right is modelled in softer riper forms.</i>
mythological	Relating to, based on, or appearing in myths or mythology. <i>The tree of life is one of the oldest of all mythological symbols.</i>
<u>paradigm</u>	The class of all items that can be substituted into the same position or slot in a grammatical sentence are in paradigmatic relation with one another. <i>Society's paradigm of the ideal woman.</i>
paradigmatic	Related as members of a substitution class. <i>His biography is paradigmatic of the experiences of this generation.</i>
<u>paragon</u>	A person or thing regarded as a perfect example of a particular quality. <i>It would have taken a paragon of virtue not to feel viciously jealous.</i>
perfect	The perfect tense. <i>A perfect summer's day.</i>
personification	A person or thing regarded as embodying a quality, concept, etc. <i>The knight is accompanied by two feminine personifications of vice.</i>

photogenic	(of an organism or tissue) producing or emitting light. <i>A photogenic child.</i>
prototype	Make a prototype of a product. <i>These objects are the prototypes of a category of rapidly spinning neutron stars.</i>
quintessence	The purest and most concentrated essence of something. <i>We were all brought up to believe that advertising is the quintessence of marketing.</i>
replica	Copy that is not the original; something that has been copied. <i>It is a replica of an antique plaque.</i>
sample	Take a sample of. <i>The input signal must be sampled at twice its highest frequency.</i>
specimen	An example of something regarded as typical of its class or group. <i>Carla could not help feeling a degree of reluctant admiration for this odd female specimen.</i>
spheroid	A solid generated by a half revolution of an ellipse about its major axis prolate spheroid or minor axis oblate spheroid. <i>It looked like a sphere but on closer examination I saw it was really a spheroid.</i>
typify	Represent; symbolize. <i>The sun typified the Greeks, and the moon the Persians.</i>
universality	The quality of being universal; existing everywhere. <i>We affirm the universality of human rights.</i>
verified	Proved to be true. <i>A verified claim.</i>
