compendium	A collection of concise but detailed information about a particular subject, especially in a book or other publication. <i>A compendium</i> of tools.
<u>digest</u>	A substance or mixture obtained by digestion. A <b>digest</b> of cloned DNA.
embodiment	A tangible or visible form of an idea, quality, or feeling. <i>The <b>embodiment</b> of hope.</i>
<u>image</u>	A personal facade that one presents to the world. I had a sudden <b>image</b> of Sal bringing me breakfast in bed.
incarnation	With reference to reincarnation each of a series of earthly lifetimes. In a previous journalistic <b>incarnation</b> I worked at Westminster.
outline	A line or set of lines enclosing or indicating the shape of an object in a sketch or diagram. An <b>outline</b> of parliamentary procedure.



<u>paradigm</u>	The class of all items that can be substituted into the same position or slot in a grammatical sentence are in paradigmatic relation with one another. <i>Society s paradigm</i> of the ideal woman.
<u>paragon</u>	An ideal instance; a perfect embodiment of a concept. It would have taken a <b>paragon</b> of virtue not to feel viciously jealous.
personification	The attribution of a personal nature or human characteristics to something non-human, or the representation of an abstract quality in human form. <i>She is the <b>personification</b> of optimism.</i>
potted version	Metal or earthenware cooking vessel that is usually round and deep; often has a handle and lid.
precis	A sketchy summary of the main points of an argument or theory.
prototype	The first, original, or typical form of something; an archetype. The construction of bandpass networks from low pass <b>prototype</b> s.
recapitulation	The repetition of an evolutionary or other process during development or growth. His <b>recapitulation</b> of the argument.
résumé	Short descriptive summary (of events.
summary	A brief statement that presents the main points in a concise form. <i>He gave a <b>summary</b> of the conclusions.</i>
<u>summation</u>	The arithmetic operation of summing; calculating the sum of two or more numbers. The <b>summation</b> of four and three gives seven.
<u>synopsis</u>	An outline of the plot of a play, film, or book. A <b>synopsis</b> of the insurance cover provided is set out below.

<u>absolute</u>	Not limited by law. <i>Absolute</i> freedom.
advisory	An official announcement or warning. The EC has put forward an <b>advisory</b> maximum figure.
<u>archetype</u>	A very typical example of a certain person or thing. <i>He was the <b>archetype</b> of the old style football club chairman.</i>



<u>chart</u>	Plot a course on a chart. The poems <b>chart</b> his descent into madness.
emulation	Reproduction of the function or action of a different computer, software system, etc. <i>A model worthy of emulation</i> .
example	An occurrence of something. They decided to make an <b>example</b> of him.
<u>exemplar</u>	Something to be imitated. An <b>exemplar</b> of success.

<u>instance</u>	An example or single occurrence of something. A serious <b>instance</b> of corruption.
lattice	An interlaced structure or pattern resembling a lattice. <i>The lattice</i> of branches above her.
mannequin	A life-size dummy used to display clothes. She was too fat to be a <b>mannequin</b> .
model	Plan or create according to a model or models. The body of the woman to the right is <b>model</b> led in softer riper forms.
mythological	Relating to, based on, or appearing in myths or mythology. The tree of life is one of the oldest of all <b>mythological</b> symbols.

paradigmatic	Related as members of a substitution class. His biography is <b>paradigmatic</b> of the experiences of this generation.
<u>paragon</u>	A person or thing regarded as a perfect example of a particular quality. It would have taken a <b>paragon</b> of virtue not to feel viciously jealous.
perfect	The perfect tense. A <b>perfect</b> summer s day.
personification	A person or thing regarded as embodying a quality, concept, etc. <i>The knight is accompanied by two feminine <b>personification</b>s of vice.</i>



<u>photogenic</u>	(of an organism or tissue) producing or emitting light. A <b>photogenic</b> child.
prototype	Make a prototype of a product. These objects are the <b>prototype</b> s of a category of rapidly spinning neutron stars.
quintessence	The purest and most concentrated essence of something. We were all brought up to believe that advertising is the <b>quintessence</b> of marketing.
<u>replica</u>	Copy that is not the original; something that has been copied. It is a <b>replica</b> of an antique plaque.
<u>sample</u>	Take a sample of. <i>The input signal must be</i> <b>sample</b> d at twice its highest frequency.
<u>specimen</u>	An example of something regarded as typical of its class or group. Carla could not help feeling a degree of reluctant admiration for this odd female <b>specimen</b> .
