### abstract

Consider a concept without thinking of a specific example consider abstractly or theoretically.

*Staff who **abstract** material for an online database.*

### digest

Treat (a substance) with heat, enzymes, or a solvent in order to decompose it or extract essential components.

*The government **digested** the entire law into a code.*

### embody

Represent or express something abstract in tangible form.

*The changes in law embodied in the Children Act.*

### encapsulate

Provide an interface for (a piece of software or hardware) to allow or simplify access for the user.

*Data requested is **encapsulated** and can be manipulated.*

### **epitomise**

Embody the essential characteristics of or be a typical example of.

### **give form to**

Convey or communicate; of a smile, a look, a physical gesture.

### **give shape to**

Transfer possession of something concrete or abstract to somebody.

### **incorporate**

Unite or merge with something already in existence.

*Add the cheeses and butter and process briefly to **incorporate** them.*

### **make a outline of** Engage in.

<b>make a résumé of</b>	Make, formulate, or derive in the mind.
<b>precis</b>	Make a precis of a text or speech.
<b>put in a nutshell</b>	Arrange thoughts, ideas, temporal events.
<b>recapitulate</b>	Repeat an earlier theme of a composition. <i>He began to <b>recapitulate</b> his argument with care.</i>
<b>sum up</b>	Be a summary of.
<b><u>summarize</u></b>	Give a brief statement of the main points of (something). <i>To <b>summarize</b> there are three main categories.</i>
<b>synthesize</b>	Give a brief summary or general survey of (something). <i>Here s my 5 minute attempt to <b>synthesize</b> the events of the last few weeks.</i>
<b>typify</b>	Express indirectly by an image, form, or model; be a symbol. <i>The sun typified the Greeks, and the moon the Persians.</i>

- *The company epitomized the problems faced by British industry.*

<b><u>accustomed</u></b>	In the habit of or adapted to. <i>His <b>accustomed</b> thoroughness.</i>
<b>classic</b>	An artist who has created classic works. <i>She made the <b>classic</b> mistake of choosing style over substance.</i>
<b>common</b>	Common sense. <i><b>Common</b> lands are set aside for use by all members of a community.</i>
<b>conservatism</b>	A political or theological orientation advocating the preservation of the best in society and opposing radical changes. <i>A party that espoused <b>conservatism</b>.</i>
<b><u>conservative</u></b>	Relating to the Conservative Party in the UK or a similar party elsewhere. <i>A <b>conservative</b> estimate.</i>
<b>conventional</b>	Conforming with accepted standards. <i><b>Conventional</b> wisdom.</i>
<b>custom</b>	Regular dealings with a shop or business by customers. <i><b>Custom</b> demanded that a person should have gifts for the child.</i>

<b>customary</b>	Established by or based on custom rather than common law or statute. <i>Took his <b>customary</b> morning walk.</i>
<b>emblem</b>	A visible symbol representing an abstract idea. <i>America's national <b>emblem</b> the bald eagle.</i>
<b>exemplary</b>	Being or serving as an illustration of a type. <i>Her works are <b>exemplary</b> of certain feminist arguments.</i>
<b>formulaic</b>	Characterized by or in accordance with some formula. <i><b>Formulaic</b> expressions such as <i>Once upon a time</i>.</i>
<b>habit</b>	Put a habit on. <i>She had a <b>habit</b> twirling the ends of her hair.</i>
<b>habitual</b>	Regular; usual. <i>A <b>habitual</b> late sleeper.</i>
<b>ingrained</b>	(used especially of ideas or principles) deeply rooted; firmly fixed or held. <i>His deeply <b>ingrained</b> Catholic convictions.</i>
<b>inveterate</b>	In a habitual and longstanding manner. <i>His <b>inveterate</b> hostility to what he considered to be the reactionary powers.</i>
<b>mediocre</b>	Lacking exceptional quality or ability. <i>There have been good and <b>mediocre</b> and bad artists.</i>
<b>normal</b>	Conforming with or constituting a norm or standard or level or type or social norm not abnormal. <i>The view is along the <b>normal</b> to the surface.</i>
<b>ordinary</b>	An early bicycle with a very large front wheel and small back wheel. <i>She seemed very <b>ordinary</b>.</i>
<b>orthodoxy</b>	A belief or orientation agreeing with conventional standards. <i>Writings of unimpeachable <b>orthodoxy</b>.</i>
<b>pigeonhole</b>	Put a document in a pigeonhole. <i>She <b>pigeonholed</b> her worry about him.</i>
<b>prejudice</b>	Disadvantage by prejudice. <i>The statement might <b>prejudice</b> the jury.</i>
<b>routine</b>	Organize according to a routine. <i>She had a catchy little <b>routine</b>.</i>
<b>stereotype</b>	View or represent as a stereotype. <i>The city is too easily <b>stereotyped</b> as an industrial wasteland.</i>
<b>stereotyped</b>	Lacking spontaneity or originality or individuality. <i>The film is weakened by its <b>stereotyped</b> characters.</i>

<b>traditional</b>	Pertaining to time-honored orthodox doctrines. <i>The simple security of <b>traditional</b> assumptions has vanished.</i>
<b>tuscan</b>	A resident of Tuscany.
<u>typical</u>	Of a feature that helps to distinguish a person or thing. <i>A <b>typical</b> suburban community.</i>
<b>typify</b>	Represent; symbolize. <i>The sun typified the Greeks, and the moon the Persians.</i>
<u>usual</u>	Habitually or typically occurring or done; customary. <i>The <b>usual</b> greeting.</i>
<u>wont</u>	Make or be or become accustomed. <i>Sons <b>wont</b> to nurse their Parents in old age.</i>
