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Associations of "Equaled" (30 Words)

akin	Of similar character. <i>Something akin to gratitude overwhelmed her.</i>
alike	Having the same or similar characteristics. <i>They looked utterly alike.</i>
as	A United States territory on the eastern part of the island of Samoa. <i>He is every bit as mean as she is.</i>
balanced	Being in a state of proper equilibrium. <i>The educated man shows a balanced development of all his powers.</i>
commensurate	Corresponding in size or degree or extent. <i>Salary will be commensurate with age and experience.</i>
comparable	Conforming in every respect. <i>The situation in Holland is comparable to that in England.</i>
compare	Draw an analogy between one thing and (another) for the purposes of explanation or clarification. <i>Individual schools compared their facilities with those of others in the area.</i>
compatible	A computer that can use software designed for another make or type. <i>Her deeds were compatible with her ideology.</i>
congruent	Coinciding when superimposed. <i>Institutional and departmental objectives are very largely congruent.</i>
consistently	In a fair and impartial way. <i>Students have to be treated consistently by all staff members.</i>
ditto	The same thing again used in lists and accounts and often indicated by a ditto mark under the word or figure to be repeated. <i>The next speaker dittoed her argument.</i>
equalize	Make equal, uniform, corresponding, or matching. <i>The purpose is to equalize the workload among tutors.</i>

<u>equally</u>	In addition and having the same importance (used to introduce a further comment). <i>The money can be divided equally between you.</i>
<u>equity</u>	The ownership interest of shareholders in a corporation. <i>People who have built up a significant amount of equity in their homes.</i>
evenhanded	Without partiality. <i>Evenhanded justice.</i>
<u>evenly</u>	In equal numbers, amounts, or values. <i>An evenly contested game.</i>
fair	Without favoring one party in a fair evenhanded manner. <i>Today will be fair and warm.</i>
<u>identical</u>	Expressing an identity. <i>The passage on the second floor was identical to the one below.</i>
indistinguishable	Exactly alike; incapable of being perceived as different. <i>They wore indistinguishable hats.</i>
<u>justice</u>	A public official authorized to decide questions brought before a court of justice. <i>A concern for justice peace and genuine respect for people.</i>
likened	Consider or describe as similar, equal, or analogous. <i>Racism is likened to a contagious disease.</i>
match	The score needed to win a match. <i>When the software finds a match it writes the correct character.</i>
par	A par score at a hole. <i>The sixteenth is a par five.</i>
proportionate	Agreeing in amount, magnitude, or degree. <i>Proportionate representation of a minority group.</i>
same	Same in identity. <i>Curtains the same color as the walls.</i>
similar	Having the same or similar characteristics. <i>The principle of treatment by similars.</i>
similitude	Similarity in appearance or character or nature between persons or things. <i>There is a striking similitude between the brother and sister.</i>
symmetrical	Having similarity in size, shape, and relative position of corresponding parts. <i>The shape of a hill smooth and symmetrical.</i>

tantamount

Being essentially equal to something.
*His statement was **tantamount** to an admission of guilt.*

twin

Grow as twins.
*Her **twin** sister.*
