## Equally as an Adverb

### Definitions of "Equally" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “equally” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *In amounts or parts that are the same in size.*
- *To the same degree (often followed by `as.*
- *In addition and having the same importance (used to introduce a further comment.*
- *In the same manner or to the same extent.*
- *In equal amounts or shares; in a balanced or impartial way.*



## Synonyms of "Equally" as an adverb (18 Words)

<b>additionally</b>	In addition, by way of addition; furthermore. <i><b>Additionally</b> 50 hours of practical experience will be necessary.</i>
<b>as</b>	To the same degree often followed by as. <i>Sang <b>as</b> sweetly <b>as</b> a nightingale.</i>
<b>as well</b>	To the same degree (often followed by `as).
<b><u>besides</u></b>	In addition. <i>I don't want to go to a restaurant <b>besides</b> we can't afford it.</i>
<b>else</b>	In addition; besides. <i>They moved on to somewhere <b>else</b>.</i>
<b>equitably</b>	In a fair and impartial manner. <i>Wealth is <b>equitably</b> distributed.</i>
<b><u>evenly</u></b>	Calmly and without strong emotion or variation. <i>An <b>evenly</b> contested game.</i>
<b><u>further</u></b>	To or at a greater distance in time or space farther is used more frequently than further in this physical sense. <i>Nothing could be <b>further</b> from his mind than marrying.</i>
<b><u>furthermore</u></b>	In addition. <i>Computer chess games are getting cheaper all the time <b>furthermore</b> their quality is improving.</i>

<b>impartially</b>	In an impartial manner. <i>The adjudicator should act <b>impartially</b> in carrying out his duties.</i>
<b>in addition</b>	To or toward the inside of.
<b>justly</b>	According to what is morally right or fair; fairly. <i>We deal <b>justly</b> with complaints.</i>
<b>moreover</b>	In addition. <i><b>Moreover</b> statistics show that competition for places is growing.</i>
<b>objectively</b>	In a way that is not dependent on the mind for existence; actually. <i>The researchers are <b>objectively</b> assessing risk factors.</i>
<b>over and above that</b>	Throughout an area.
<b>then</b>	Subsequently or soon afterward (often used as sentence connectors). <i>Phoebe by <b>then</b> was exhausted.</i>
<b>too</b>	To a higher degree than is desirable, permissible, or possible; excessively. <i>He wore suits that seemed a size <b>too</b> small for him.</i>
<b>what's more</b>	Comparative of much; to a greater degree or extent.

## Usage Examples of "Equally" as an adverb

- *Not all who live in inner cities are poor; equally, many poor people live outside inner cities.*
- *They were equally beautiful.*
- *The money can be divided equally between you.*
- *They split their winnings equally.*
- *All children should be treated equally.*
- *Follow-up discussion is equally important.*
- *Deal equally with rich and poor.*

<b>alike</b>	Having the same or similar characteristics. <i>They looked utterly <b>alike</b>.</i>
<b>applicable</b>	Capable of being applied; having relevance. <i>Gave <b>applicable</b> examples to support her argument.</i>
<b>as</b>	A United States territory on the eastern part of the island of Samoa. <i>Go <b>as fast as</b> you can.</i>
<b>assuring</b>	Giving confidence.

<b>balanced</b>	(of a person or state of mind) having no emotion too strong or too weak; stable. <i>The carefully <b>balanced</b> seesaw.</i>
<u><a href="#">commensurate</a></u>	Corresponding in size or degree or extent. <i>Salary will be <b>commensurate</b> with age and experience.</i>
<u><a href="#">congruent</a></u>	Coinciding when superimposed. <i>The rules may not be <b>congruent</b> with the requirements of the law.</i>
<b>consistently</b>	In a systematic or consistent manner. <i>A team that <b>consistently</b> demonstrates a desire to win.</i>
<b>distribute</b>	Be distributed or spread as in statistical analyses. <i>Values <b>distribute</b>.</i>
<u><a href="#">ditto</a></u>	The same thing again used in lists and accounts and often indicated by a ditto mark under the word or figure to be repeated. <i>The next speaker <b>dittoed</b> her argument.</i>
<b>equal</b>	Be equal to in quality or ability. <i>The players proved <b>equal</b> to the task.</i>
<u><a href="#">equalize</a></u>	Become equal to a specified or standard level. <i>Britain is required to <b>equalize</b> pension rights between men and women.</i>
<b>equitable</b>	Fair and impartial. <i><b>Equitable</b> treatment of all citizens.</i>
<b>evenhanded</b>	Without partiality. <i><b>Evenhanded</b> justice.</i>
<u><a href="#">evenly</a></u>	In equal amounts or shares; in a balanced or impartial way. <i>A series of <b>evenly</b> spaced dots.</i>
<b>fair</b>	Without favoring one party in a fair evenhanded manner. <i>A pretty girl with long <b>fair</b> hair.</i>
<u><a href="#">identical</a></u>	Similar in every detail; exactly alike. <i><b>Identical</b> twins are monovular.</i>
<b>importantly</b>	In an important way or to an important degree. <i>A non drinking non smoking and <b>importantly</b> non political sportsman.</i>
<b>indistinguishable</b>	Not able to be identified as different or distinct. <i>The two specimens are actually different from each other but the differences are almost <b>indistinguishable</b>.</i>
<b>isochronous</b>	Equal in duration or interval.
<u><a href="#">just</a></u>	Of an opinion or appraisal well founded justifiable. <i>Inflation fell to <b>just</b> over 4 per cent.</i>

<b><u>justice</u></b>	A public official authorized to decide questions brought before a court of justice. <i>The <b>justice</b> of his case.</i>
<b>liken</b>	Point out the resemblance of someone or something to. <i>Racism is <b>likened</b> to a contagious disease.</i>
<b>proportionate</b>	Agreeing in amount, magnitude, or degree. <i><b>Proportionate</b> representation of a minority group.</i>
<b><u>regularly</u></b>	Having a regular form. <i>Letters arrived <b>regularly</b> from his children.</i>
<b>same</b>	Similarly in the same way. <i>Curtains the <b>same</b> color as the walls.</i>
<b>similar</b>	Having the same or similar characteristics. <i>Northern India and <b>similar</b> areas.</i>
<b><u>tantamount</u></b>	Being essentially equal to something. <i>The resignations were <b>tantamount</b> to an admission of guilt.</i>
<b>unbiased</b>	Showing no prejudice for or against something; impartial. <i>They give clear <b>unbiased</b> advice.</i>
<b>uniformly</b>	In a way that is the same in all cases and at all times. <i>The rules are applied <b>uniformly</b>.</i>
