Definitions of "Equally" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “equally” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *In amounts or parts that are the same in size.*
- *To the same degree (often followed by `as.*
- *In addition and having the same importance (used to introduce a further comment.*
- *In the same manner or to the same extent.*
- *In equal amounts or shares; in a balanced or impartial way.*



Synonyms of "Equally" as an adverb (18 Words)

additionally	In addition, by way of addition; furthermore. <i>Additionally 50 hours of practical experience will be necessary.</i>
as	To the same degree often followed by as. <i>Sang as sweetly as a nightingale.</i>
as well	To the same degree (often followed by `as).
<u>besides</u>	In addition. <i>I don't want to go to a restaurant besides we can't afford it.</i>
else	In addition; besides. <i>They moved on to somewhere else.</i>
equitably	In a fair and impartial manner. <i>Wealth is equitably distributed.</i>
<u>evenly</u>	Calmly and without strong emotion or variation. <i>An evenly contested game.</i>
<u>further</u>	To or at a greater distance in time or space farther is used more frequently than further in this physical sense. <i>Nothing could be further from his mind than marrying.</i>
<u>furthermore</u>	In addition. <i>Computer chess games are getting cheaper all the time furthermore their quality is improving.</i>

impartially	In an impartial manner. <i>The adjudicator should act impartially in carrying out his duties.</i>
in addition	To or toward the inside of.
justly	According to what is morally right or fair; fairly. <i>We deal justly with complaints.</i>
moreover	In addition. <i>Moreover statistics show that competition for places is growing.</i>
objectively	In a way that is not dependent on the mind for existence; actually. <i>The researchers are objectively assessing risk factors.</i>
over and above that	Throughout an area.
then	Subsequently or soon afterward (often used as sentence connectors). <i>Phoebe by then was exhausted.</i>
too	To a higher degree than is desirable, permissible, or possible; excessively. <i>He wore suits that seemed a size too small for him.</i>
what's more	Comparative of much; to a greater degree or extent.

Usage Examples of "Equally" as an adverb

- *Not all who live in inner cities are poor; equally, many poor people live outside inner cities.*
- *They were equally beautiful.*
- *The money can be divided equally between you.*
- *They split their winnings equally.*
- *All children should be treated equally.*
- *Follow-up discussion is equally important.*
- *Deal equally with rich and poor.*

alike	Having the same or similar characteristics. <i>They looked utterly alike.</i>
applicable	Capable of being applied; having relevance. <i>Gave applicable examples to support her argument.</i>
as	A United States territory on the eastern part of the island of Samoa. <i>Go as fast as you can.</i>
assuring	Giving confidence.

balanced	(of a person or state of mind) having no emotion too strong or too weak; stable. <i>The carefully balanced seesaw.</i>
<u>commensurate</u>	Corresponding in size or degree or extent. <i>Salary will be commensurate with age and experience.</i>
<u>congruent</u>	Coinciding when superimposed. <i>The rules may not be congruent with the requirements of the law.</i>
consistently	In a systematic or consistent manner. <i>A team that consistently demonstrates a desire to win.</i>
distribute	Be distributed or spread as in statistical analyses. <i>Values distribute.</i>
<u>ditto</u>	The same thing again used in lists and accounts and often indicated by a ditto mark under the word or figure to be repeated. <i>The next speaker dittoed her argument.</i>
equal	Be equal to in quality or ability. <i>The players proved equal to the task.</i>
<u>equalize</u>	Become equal to a specified or standard level. <i>Britain is required to equalize pension rights between men and women.</i>
equitable	Fair and impartial. <i>Equitable treatment of all citizens.</i>
evenhanded	Without partiality. <i>Evenhanded justice.</i>
<u>evenly</u>	In equal amounts or shares; in a balanced or impartial way. <i>A series of evenly spaced dots.</i>
fair	Without favoring one party in a fair evenhanded manner. <i>A pretty girl with long fair hair.</i>
<u>identical</u>	Similar in every detail; exactly alike. <i>Identical twins are monovular.</i>
importantly	In an important way or to an important degree. <i>A non drinking non smoking and importantly non political sportsman.</i>
indistinguishable	Not able to be identified as different or distinct. <i>The two specimens are actually different from each other but the differences are almost indistinguishable.</i>
isochronous	Equal in duration or interval.
<u>just</u>	Of an opinion or appraisal well founded justifiable. <i>Inflation fell to just over 4 per cent.</i>

<u>justice</u>	A public official authorized to decide questions brought before a court of justice. <i>The justice of his case.</i>
liken	Point out the resemblance of someone or something to. <i>Racism is likened to a contagious disease.</i>
proportionate	Agreeing in amount, magnitude, or degree. <i>Proportionate representation of a minority group.</i>
<u>regularly</u>	Having a regular form. <i>Letters arrived regularly from his children.</i>
same	Similarly in the same way. <i>Curtains the same color as the walls.</i>
similar	Having the same or similar characteristics. <i>Northern India and similar areas.</i>
<u>tantamount</u>	Being essentially equal to something. <i>The resignations were tantamount to an admission of guilt.</i>
unbiased	Showing no prejudice for or against something; impartial. <i>They give clear unbiased advice.</i>
uniformly	In a way that is the same in all cases and at all times. <i>The rules are applied uniformly.</i>
