- Provide with abilities or understanding.
- Prepare (someone) mentally for a particular situation or task.

Make correspond or harmonize.
Be a source of; provide. Fish furnish an important source of protein.
Prepare and issue for public distribution or sale. Issue a new uniform to the children.



<u>outfit</u>	Provide with a set of clothes. Warders outfit ted in special suits.
<u>prepare</u>	Prepare for eating by applying heat. She took time off to prepare for her exams.
provide	Make a possibility or provide opportunity for permit to be attainable or cause to remain. This procedure provide s for lots of leeway.
provision	Supply with provisions. The provision ing of US ships.
<u>qualify</u>	Officially recognize or establish (someone) as a practitioner of a particular profession or activity. The courses qualify you as an instructor of the sport.
rig out	Connect or secure to.
<u>stock</u>	Provide or furnish with a stock of something. Stock a farm.
suit	Accord or comport with. This kind of behavior does not suit a young woman.
supply	Take over (a vacant place or role. When she died no one could supply her place.






Usage Examples of "Equip" as a verb

Associations of "Equip" (30 Words)

adduce	Cite as evidence. A number of factors are adduce d to explain the situation.
apparel	Clothing in general. They were dressed in bright apparel .
<u>attire</u>	Be dressed in clothes of a specified kind. Lady Agatha was attire d in an elaborate evening gown.
caparison	Put a caparison on. <i>Caparison</i> the horses for the festive occasion.
<u>cater</u>	Provide food and drink for (an event. He cater ed a lunch for 20 people.
<u>closet</u>	A small private room for study or prayer. He was closet ed with the king.
clothed	Wearing or provided with clothing; sometimes used in combination. <i>A partially clothed</i> body.



clothes	Bedclothes. He always bought his clothes at the same store.
clothing	Clothes collectively. Bring warm clothing and waterproofs.
<u>costume</u>	A swimming costume. Authentic Elizabethan costume s.
<u>don</u>	Teacher at a university or college (especially at Cambridge or Oxford. The princess don ned a long blue dress.
<u>dress</u>	Dress in a certain manner. She likes to dress when going to the opera.
<u>dressed</u>	Dressed or clothed especially in fine attire often used in combination. A fine frontage in red brick with dressed white stone on the facings.
<u>furnish</u>	Provide or equip with furniture. The proprietor has furnish ed the bedrooms in a variety of styles.
<u>outfit</u>	A complete set of equipment needed for a particular purpose. An obscure 1970s country rock outfit .
panoply	An extensive or impressive collection. I leaned forward to take in the full panoply of tourist London.
provide	Make a possibility or provide opportunity for permit to be attainable or cause to remain. We provide d the room with an electrical heater.
purvey	Supply with provisions. Shops purvey ing cooked food.
refuel	Supply (a vehicle) with more fuel. The authorities agreed to refuel the plane.
render	To surrender someone or something to another. Render fat in a casserole.
<u>replenish</u>	Restore (a stock or supply) to a former level or condition. <i>He replenished Justin s glass with mineral water.</i>
restock	Replenish (a store) with fresh stock or supplies. Work began at once to restock the fishery.
rig	Provide a sailing boat with sails and rigging. The stronger the wind the later you release the rig .
setup	Equipment designed to serve a specific function. It takes time to learn the setup around here.
skimpy	Providing or consisting of less than is needed; meagre. A skimpy dress.



suit	A lawsuit. The family brought suit against the landlord.
supply	The activity of supplying or providing something. The two reservoirs supply about 1 of the city s needs.
toga	A loose flowing outer garment worn by the citizens of ancient Rome, made of a single piece of cloth and covering the whole body apart from the right arm.
uniformed	Wearing a uniform. Uniformed policemen lined the President s route.
wear	Have in one s aspect wear an expression of one s attitude or personality.
