## Equip as a Verb

### Definitions of "Equip" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “equip” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Provide with (something) usually for a specific purpose.*
- *Supply with the necessary items for a particular purpose.*
- *Provide with abilities or understanding.*
- *Prepare (someone) mentally for a particular situation or task.*



## Synonyms of "Equip" as a verb (16 Words)

<b>arm</b>	Supply with arms. <i>The U S <b>armed</b> the freedom fighters in Afghanistan.</i>
<b>deck out</b>	Be beautiful to look at.
<b>endow</b>	Furnish with an endowment. <i>He was <b>endowed</b> with tremendous physical strength.</i>
<b>fit</b>	Be the right size or shape fit correctly or as desired. <i>Those jeans still <b>fit</b> me.</i>
<b>fit out</b>	Make correspond or harmonize.
<b>furnish</b>	Be a source of; provide. <i>Fish <b>furnish</b> an important source of protein.</i>
<b>issue</b>	Prepare and issue for public distribution or sale. <i><b>Issue</b> a new uniform to the children.</i>

<b><u>outfit</u></b>	Provide with a set of clothes. <i>Warders <b>outfitted</b> in special suits.</i>
<b><u>prepare</u></b>	Prepare for eating by applying heat. <i>She took time off to <b>prepare</b> for her exams.</i>
<b>provide</b>	Make a possibility or provide opportunity for permit to be attainable or cause to remain. <i>This procedure <b>provides</b> for lots of leeway.</i>
<b>provision</b>	Supply with provisions. <i>The <b>provisioning</b> of US ships.</i>
<b><u>qualify</u></b>	Officially recognize or establish (someone) as a practitioner of a particular profession or activity. <i>The courses <b>qualify</b> you as an instructor of the sport.</i>
<b>rig out</b>	Connect or secure to.
<b><u>stock</u></b>	Provide or furnish with a stock of something. <i><b>Stock</b> a farm.</i>
<b>suit</b>	Accord or comport with. <i>This kind of behavior does not <b>suit</b> a young woman.</i>
<b>supply</b>	Take over (a vacant place or role). <i>When she died no one could <b>supply</b> her place.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Equip" as a verb

- *They equipped themselves for the campaign.*
- *The expedition was equipped with proper clothing, food, and other necessities.*
- *I don't think he's equipped for the modern age.*
- *She was never equipped to be a dancer.*
- *All bedrooms are equipped with a colour TV.*





## Associations of "Equip" (30 Words)

<b>adduce</b>	Cite as evidence. <i>A number of factors are <b>adduced</b> to explain the situation.</i>
<b>apparel</b>	Clothing in general. <i>They were dressed in bright <b>apparel</b>.</i>
<b><u>attire</u></b>	Be dressed in clothes of a specified kind. <i>Lady Agatha was <b>attired</b> in an elaborate evening gown.</i>
<b>caparison</b>	Put a caparison on. <i><b>Caparison</b> the horses for the festive occasion.</i>
<b><u>cater</u></b>	Provide food and drink for (an event). <i>He <b>catered</b> a lunch for 20 people.</i>
<b><u>closet</u></b>	A small private room for study or prayer. <i>He was <b>closeted</b> with the king.</i>
<b>clothed</b>	Wearing or provided with clothing; sometimes used in combination. <i>A partially <b>clothed</b> body.</i>

<b>clothes</b>	Bedclothes. <i>He always bought his <b>clothes</b> at the same store.</i>
<b>clothing</b>	Clothes collectively. <i>Bring warm <b>clothing</b> and waterproofs.</i>
<b>costume</b>	A swimming costume. <i>Authentic Elizabethan <b>costumes</b>.</i>
<b>don</b>	Teacher at a university or college (especially at Cambridge or Oxford). <i>The princess <b>donned</b> a long blue dress.</i>
<b>dress</b>	Dress in a certain manner. <i>She likes to <b>dress</b> when going to the opera.</i>
<b>dressed</b>	Dressed or clothed especially in fine attire often used in combination. <i>A fine frontage in red brick with <b>dressed</b> white stone on the facings.</i>
<b>furnish</b>	Provide or equip with furniture. <i>The proprietor has <b>furnished</b> the bedrooms in a variety of styles.</i>
<b>outfit</b>	A complete set of equipment needed for a particular purpose. <i>An obscure 1970s country rock <b>outfit</b>.</i>
<b>panoply</b>	An extensive or impressive collection. <i>I leaned forward to take in the full <b>panoply</b> of tourist London.</i>
<b>provide</b>	Make a possibility or provide opportunity for permit to be attainable or cause to remain. <i>We <b>provided</b> the room with an electrical heater.</i>
<b>purvey</b>	Supply with provisions. <i>Shops <b>purveying</b> cooked food.</i>
<b>refuel</b>	Supply (a vehicle) with more fuel. <i>The authorities agreed to <b>refuel</b> the plane.</i>
<b>render</b>	To surrender someone or something to another. <i><b>Render</b> fat in a casserole.</i>
<b>replenish</b>	Restore (a stock or supply) to a former level or condition. <i>He <b>replenished</b> Justin's glass with mineral water.</i>
<b>restock</b>	Replenish (a store) with fresh stock or supplies. <i>Work began at once to <b>restock</b> the fishery.</i>
<b>rig</b>	Provide a sailing boat with sails and rigging. <i>The stronger the wind the later you release the <b>rig</b>.</i>
<b>setup</b>	Equipment designed to serve a specific function. <i>It takes time to learn the <b>setup</b> around here.</i>
<b>skimpy</b>	Providing or consisting of less than is needed; meagre. <i>A <b>skimpy</b> dress.</i>



- suit** A lawsuit.  
*The family brought **suit** against the landlord.*
- supply** The activity of supplying or providing something.  
*The two reservoirs **supply** about 1 of the city s needs.*
- toga** A loose flowing outer garment worn by the citizens of ancient Rome, made of a single piece of cloth and covering the whole body apart from the right arm.
- uniformed** Wearing a uniform.  
***Uniformed** policemen lined the President s route.*
- wear** Have in one s aspect wear an expression of one s attitude or personality.  
*You need to make a deduction for **wear** and tear on all your belongings.*
