## **Equipped as an Adjective**

### **Definitions of "Equipped" as an adjective**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “equipped” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Provided or fitted out with what is necessary or useful or appropriate.*
- *Carrying weapons.*
- *Provided with whatever is necessary for a purpose (as furniture or equipment or authority).*
- *Prepared with proper equipment.*



## Synonyms of "Equipped" as an adjective (4 Words)

**equipt** Provided or fitted out with what is necessary or useful or appropriate.

**fitted out** Not worth considering as a possibility.

**furnished** Provided with whatever is necessary for a purpose (as furniture or equipment or authority.

A **furnished** apartment.

**weaponed** Carrying weapons.



## Usage Examples of "Equipped" as an adjective

- *A ship equipped with every mechanical aid to navigation.*
- *Equipped for service in the Arctic.*
- *A well equipped playground.*

<b>allotted</b>	Given as a task. <i>Her <b>allotted</b> chores.</i>
<b>amply</b>	Enough or more than enough; plentifully. <i>The evidence <b>amply</b> or fully confirms our suspicions.</i>
<b>appointed</b>	Subject to appointment. <i>At the time <b>appointed</b> or the <b>appointed</b> time.</i>
<b>appropriately</b>	In accordance with what is appropriate or suitable for the circumstances. <i>Volunteers need to be approachable calm and able to respond <b>appropriately</b>.</i>
<b>aptly</b>	With competence; in a competent capable manner. <i>America s <b>aptly</b> named Sunshine State.</i>
<b>assigned</b>	Appointed to a post or duty. <i><b>Assigned</b> personnel.</i>

<b>automated</b>	Operated by largely automatic equipment. <i>An <b>automated</b> stoker.</i>
<b>completely</b>	Totally; utterly. <i>Was <b>completely</b> at fault.</i>
<b>configure</b>	Arrange or put together in a particular form or configuration. <i><b>Configure</b> a plane for a combat mission.</i>
<u>conversant</u>	Well informed about or knowing thoroughly. <i>You need someone who is <b>conversant</b> with the new technology.</i>
<b>duly</b>	In accordance with what is required or appropriate; following proper procedure or arrangement. <i>A document <b>duly</b> signed and authorized by the inspector.</i>
<b>entire</b>	Constituting the undiminished entirety lacking nothing essential especially not damaged. <i>Was able to keep the collection <b>entire</b> during his lifetime.</i>
<b>executor</b>	A person appointed by a testator to carry out the terms of the will. <i>The <b>executors</b> of the late John B Smith.</i>
<b>fully</b>	Sufficiently; more than adequately. <i>I <b>fully</b> understand the fears of the workers.</i>
<b>furnished</b>	Provided with whatever is necessary for a purpose (as furniture or equipment or authority). <i>A <b>furnished</b> apartment.</i>
<b>given</b>	Specified or stated. <i>At a couture house attentive service is a <b>given</b>.</i>
<u>install</u>	Put into an office or a position. <i><b>Install</b> the washer and dryer.</i>
<b>occupancy</b>	The action or fact of occupying a place. <i>Occupation of a building without a certificate of <b>occupancy</b> is illegal.</i>
<b>ordained</b>	Fixed or established especially by order or command. <i>An <b>ordained</b> priest.</i>
<b>penetrable</b>	Capable of being penetrated. <i>The outer membrane is <b>penetrable</b>.</i>
<b>prepared</b>	Equipped or prepared with necessary intellectual resources. <i>The spokesman was reading a <b>prepared</b> statement.</i>
<b>prescribed</b>	Conforming to set usage, procedure, or discipline. <i>In <b>prescribed</b> order.</i>
<u>properly</u>	With reason or justice. <i>On the first day she felt <b>properly</b> well Millie sat out on the front steps.</i>

<b>ready</b>	Make ready or suitable or equip in advance for a particular purpose or for some use event etc. <i><b>Ready</b> for action.</i>
<b>ripen</b>	Cause to ripen or develop fully. <i>The plums <b>ripen</b> in July.</i>
<b>set</b>	Set to a certain position or cause to operate correctly. <i>The scheme <b>sets</b> a precedent for other companies.</i>
<b>settled</b>	Inhabited by colonists. <i>The advent of <b>settled</b> civilization.</i>
<b>setup</b>	The way something is organized or arranged. <i>It takes time to learn the <b>setup</b> around here.</i>
<b>standby</b>	Readiness for duty or immediate deployment. <i>A <b>standby</b> crew.</i>
<b>suitably</b>	In accordance with what is appropriate or suitable for the circumstances. <i>The judges were <b>suitably</b> impressed.</i>
