<b>learned</b>	Used as a courteous description of a lawyer in certain formal contexts. <i>A <b>learned</b> jurist.</i>
<b>lettered</b>	Highly educated; having extensive information or understanding. <i>Though not <b>lettered</b> he read widely.</i>
<b><u>scholarly</u></b>	Involving or relating to serious academic study. <i>A <b>scholarly</b> treatise.</i>
<b>well educated</b>	In good health especially after having suffered illness or injury.
<b>well informed</b>	Resulting favorably.
<b>well read</b>	In good health especially after having suffered illness or injury.
<b>well versed</b>	Wise or advantageous and hence advisable.

<b>enlightenment</b>	The action or state of attaining or having attained spiritual knowledge or insight, in particular (in Buddhism) that awareness which frees a person from the cycle of rebirth. <i>The key to <b>enlightenment</b> is the way of the Buddha.</i>
<b>experienced</b>	Having gained knowledge or skill in a particular field over time. <i>She was <b>experienced</b> in marketing.</i>
<b>genteel</b>	Characterized by exaggerated or affected politeness, refinement, or respectability. <i>Her <b>genteel</b> upbringing.</i>
<b>highbrow</b>	A highbrow person. <i>Innovatory art had a small mostly <b>highbrow</b> following.</i>
<b>informed</b>	(of a decision or judgement) based on an understanding of the facts of the situation. <i>The <b>informed</b> customer.</i>
<b>intellectual</b>	Relating to the intellect. <i><b>Intellectual</b> workers engaged in creative literary or artistic or scientific labor.</i>
<b>intelligent</b>	Having the capacity for thought and reason especially to a high degree. <i>An <b>intelligent</b> solution.</i>
<b>knowing</b>	Alert and fully informed. <i>Today s society is too <b>knowing</b> too corrupt.</i>
<b>knowledge</b>	The psychological result of perception and learning and reasoning. <i>The programme had been developed without his <b>knowledge</b>.</i>

<b>rote</b>	Memorization by repetition. <i><b>Rote</b> learning.</i>
<b>scholarly</b>	Involving or relating to serious academic study. <i>A <b>scholarly</b> attitude.</i>
<b>smart</b>	(of an object) bright and fresh in appearance. <i>A <b>smart</b> blue skirt.</i>

<b>sophistication</b>	Falsification by the use of sophistry; misleading by means of specious fallacies. <i>The technological <b>sophistication</b> of their products.</i>
<u><b>studious</b></u>	Done deliberately or with a purpose in mind. <i>He was quiet and <b>studious</b>.</i>
<b>trained</b>	Having been taught a particular skill or type of behaviour through practice and instruction over a period of time. <i>The riding school was founded in the 16th century to provide <b>trained</b> horses for the Imperial Army.</i>
<b>understanding</b>	Characterized by understanding based on comprehension and discernment and empathy. <i>He wrote with <b>understanding</b> and affection of the people of Dent.</i>
