<u>install</u>	Put into an office or a position. <i>Install the washer and dryer.</i>
institute	Set up or lay the groundwork for. <i>The award was instituted in 1900.</i>
launch	Launch for the first time launch on a maiden voyage. <i>A chair was launched at him.</i>
lay down	Put into a certain place or abstract location.
make	Make by shaping or bringing together constituents. <i>Anyone can make a mistake.</i>
plant	Place a plant in the ground out of doors so it can grow especially after growing it from seed in an indoor environment. <i>It was raining when we planted him.</i>
prove	Prove formally demonstrate by a mathematical formal proof. <i>The scheme has proved a great success.</i>
set up	Disappear beyond the horizon.
shew	Establish the validity of something, as by an example, explanation or experiment.
show	Show in or as in a picture. <i>It was Frank s turn to show his frustration.</i>

arrange	Arrange thoughts ideas temporal events. <i>Accommodation can be arranged if required.</i>
arranged	Deliberately arranged for effect. <i>Haphazardly arranged interlobular septa.</i>
array	An impressive display. <i>They were arrayed in Hungarian national dress.</i>
based	Having a base of operations (often used as a combining form). <i>Firmly based ice.</i>
build	Build or establish something abstract. <i>The government is building new schools in this state.</i>
colony	A group of people living in a colony consisting of the original settlers and their descendants and successors. <i>Japanese forces overran the French colony of Indo China.</i>
configure	Arrange or order (a computer system or an element of it) so as to fit it for a designated task. <i>The memory can be configured as a virtual drive.</i>

cook	Someone who cooks food. <i>A narcotics team who cooked the evidence.</i>
coordinate	Form a coordinate bond to an atom or molecule. <i>Cross references in the catalogue link subjects which may be coordinate.</i>
create	Create by artistic means. <i>He was created a baronet.</i>
devise	(law) a gift of real property by will. <i>A training programme should be devised.</i>
fixing	Restraint that attaches to something or holds something in place. <i>Several laws restricted the fixing of retail prices.</i>
found	Set up or found. <i>Found art.</i>
furnish	Supply someone with (something); give (something) to someone. <i>She was able to furnish me with details of the incident.</i>
install	Set up for use. <i>Install the washer and dryer.</i>

institute	Advance or set forth in court. <i>The state instituted a national lottery.</i>
<u>invent</u>	Make up (an idea, name, story, etc.), especially so as to deceive someone. <i>He invented an improved form of the steam engine.</i>
make	Make formulate or derive in the mind. <i>He wasn't going to make captain.</i>
ordered	Marked by an orderly, logical, and aesthetically consistent relation of parts. <i>An ordered sequence.</i>
<u>organize</u>	Bring order and organization to. <i>Organize lessons in a planned way.</i>
<u>prepare</u>	To prepare verbally either for written or spoken delivery. <i>Prepare a speech.</i>
ready	Make ready or suitable or equip in advance for a particular purpose or for some use event etc. <i>A ready source of cash.</i>
reclaim	The action or process of reclaiming or being reclaimed. <i>Allow a week or ten days for reclaiming the bird.</i>
replenishment	Restoration of a stock or supply to a former level or condition. <i>A target for replenishment of depleted fish stocks.</i>
set	Put or set seeds seedlings or plants into the ground. <i>The sun sets early these days.</i>
setup	The way something is organized or arranged. <i>It takes time to learn the setup around here.</i>
sizing	Any glutinous material used to fill pores in surfaces or to stiffen fabrics.
suitably	In a way that is right or appropriate for a particular purpose or situation. <i>The post is open to suitably qualified applicants from all over the world.</i>
troubleshoot	Solve problems. <i>Follow the error messages to troubleshoot.</i>
