Etched as an Adjective

Definitions of "Etched" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “etched” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Made by or subjected to etching.*
- *Cut or impressed into a surface.*



Synonyms of "Etched" as an adjective (4 Words)

engraved Cut or impressed into a surface.
Engraved invitations.

graven Cut or impressed into a surface.
Graven images.

incised Sharply and deeply indented.
An *incised* design.

inscribed Cut or impressed into a surface.
An *inscribed* watch.



Usage Examples of "Etched" as an adjective

- *Etched figures.*
- *Etched glass windows.*



Associations of "Etched" (30 Words)

- alabaster** Like alabaster in whiteness and smoothness.
Alabaster statue.
- carve** Cut (a slice of meat) from a larger piece.
*The altar was **carved** from a block of solid jade.*
- carving** The action of carving.
*A **carving** of an Asian elephant.*
- caryatid** A stone carving of a draped female figure, used as a pillar to support the entablature of a Greek or Greek-style building.

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| chisel | Carve with a chisel. <i>He s chiselled me out of my dues.</i> |
| cut | Used of grass or vegetation cut down with a hand implement or machine. <i>Cut a caper.</i> |
| emblazon | Celebrate or extol publicly. <i>Their success was emblazoned.</i> |
| emboss | Carve, mould, or stamp (a design) on a surface or object. <i>They used special tools to emboss the leather.</i> |
| engrave | Impress or affect deeply. <i>My name was engraved on the ring.</i> |
| etching | A print produced by the process of etching. <i>The artist dispensed with the medium of etching.</i> |
| forwarding | The advancement of some enterprise. <i>Chain letter forwarding scams.</i> |
| gargoyle | An ornament consisting of a grotesquely carved figure of a person or animal. |
| gouge | Obtain by coercion or intimidation. <i>He d gouged wads out of Morty.</i> |
| incise | Cut (a mark or decoration) into a surface. <i>The wound was incised and drained.</i> |
| inscribe | Write a dedication to someone in (a book). <i>The memorial is inscribed with ten names.</i> |
| landmark | The boundary of an area of land, or an object marking this. <i>The spire was once a landmark for ships sailing up the river.</i> |
| marble | A marble sculpture. <i>A couple of girls were playing marbles.</i> |
| memorial | A statement of facts, especially as the basis of a petition. <i>A memorial to General Robert E Lee.</i> |
| monument | An enduring and memorable example of something. <i>A monument to Magellan is in the main square of the city.</i> |
| plaque | An ornamental tablet, typically of metal, porcelain, or wood, that is fixed to a wall or other surface in commemoration of a person or event. <i>Plaque around gum margins can lead to gingivitis.</i> |
| scraper | A tool or device used for scraping, especially for removing dirt, paint, or other unwanted matter from a surface. <i>A wallpaper scraper.</i> |
| sculpt | Create by shaping stone or wood or any other hard material. <i>Sculpt a swan out of a block of ice.</i> |

- sculpture** A work of art made by sculpture.
*Ammonite shells with external **sculpture** near the aperture.*
- seascape** A depiction of a seascape.
- slab** Remove slabs from a log or tree to prepare it for sawing into planks.
*He averted his eyes from the corpse on the **slab**.*
- statue** A carved or cast figure of a person or animal, especially one that is life-size or larger.
- stone** A large flat table or sheet originally made of stone and now usually of metal on which pages of type are made up.
*Two people were **stoned** to death.*
- totem** A clan or tribe identified by their kinship to a common totemic object.
*Other radical groups look to the party as a **totem** of the anti austerity movement.*
- trptych** Art consisting of a painting or carving (especially an altarpiece) on three panels (usually hinged together).
*His **trptych** of one act operas is unfairly neglected.*
- whet** Sharpen by rubbing as on a whetstone.
*The selection of quotations may **whet** your curiosity to investigate the source material.*
