### Definitions of "Etched" as an adjective

- *Made by or subjected to etching.*
- *Cut or impressed into a surface.*



## Synonyms of "Etched" as an adjective (4 Words)

**engraved** Cut or impressed into a surface.  
***Engraved** invitations.*

**graven** Cut or impressed into a surface.  
***Graven** images.*

**incised** Sharply and deeply indented.  
*An **incised** design.*

**inscribed** Cut or impressed into a surface.  
*An **inscribed** watch.*







## Usage Examples of "Etched" as an adjective

- *Etched figures.*
- *Etched glass windows.*



## Associations of "Etched" (30 Words)

- alabaster** Like alabaster in whiteness and smoothness.  
***Alabaster** statue.*
- carve** Cut (a slice of meat) from a larger piece.  
*The altar was **carved** from a block of solid jade.*
- carving** The action of carving.  
*A **carving** of an Asian elephant.*
- caryatid** A stone carving of a draped female figure, used as a pillar to support the entablature of a Greek or Greek-style building.

<b>chisel</b>	Carve with a chisel. <i>He s <b>chiselled</b> me out of my dues.</i>
<b>cut</b>	Used of grass or vegetation cut down with a hand implement or machine. <i><b>Cut</b> a caper.</i>
<b>emblazon</b>	Celebrate or extol publicly. <i>Their success was <b>emblazoned</b>.</i>
<b>emboss</b>	Carve, mould, or stamp (a design) on a surface or object. <i>They used special tools to <b>emboss</b> the leather.</i>
<b>engrave</b>	Impress or affect deeply. <i>My name was <b>engraved</b> on the ring.</i>
<b>etching</b>	A print produced by the process of etching. <i>The artist dispensed with the medium of <b>etching</b>.</i>
<b>forwarding</b>	The advancement of some enterprise. <i>Chain letter <b>forwarding</b> scams.</i>
<b>gargoyle</b>	An ornament consisting of a grotesquely carved figure of a person or animal.
<b>gouge</b>	Obtain by coercion or intimidation. <i>He d <b>gouged</b> wads out of Morty.</i>
<b>incise</b>	Cut (a mark or decoration) into a surface. <i>The wound was <b>incised</b> and drained.</i>
<b>inscribe</b>	Write a dedication to someone in (a book). <i>The memorial is <b>inscribed</b> with ten names.</i>
<b>landmark</b>	The boundary of an area of land, or an object marking this. <i>The spire was once a <b>landmark</b> for ships sailing up the river.</i>
<b>marble</b>	A marble sculpture. <i>A couple of girls were playing <b>marbles</b>.</i>
<b>memorial</b>	A statement of facts, especially as the basis of a petition. <i>A <b>memorial</b> to General Robert E Lee.</i>
<b>monument</b>	An enduring and memorable example of something. <i>A <b>monument</b> to Magellan is in the main square of the city.</i>
<b>plaque</b>	An ornamental tablet, typically of metal, porcelain, or wood, that is fixed to a wall or other surface in commemoration of a person or event. <i><b>Plaque</b> around gum margins can lead to gingivitis.</i>
<b>scraper</b>	A tool or device used for scraping, especially for removing dirt, paint, or other unwanted matter from a surface. <i>A wallpaper <b>scraper</b>.</i>
<b>sculpt</b>	Create by shaping stone or wood or any other hard material. <i><b>Sculpt</b> a swan out of a block of ice.</i>



<b>sculpture</b>	A work of art made by sculpture. <i>Ammonite shells with external <b>sculpture</b> near the aperture.</i>
<b>seascape</b>	A depiction of a seascape.
<b>slab</b>	Remove slabs from a log or tree to prepare it for sawing into planks. <i>He averted his eyes from the corpse on the <b>slab</b>.</i>
<b>statue</b>	A carved or cast figure of a person or animal, especially one that is life-size or larger.
<b>stone</b>	A large flat table or sheet originally made of stone and now usually of metal on which pages of type are made up. <i>Two people were <b>stoned</b> to death.</i>
<b>totem</b>	A clan or tribe identified by their kinship to a common totemic object. <i>Other radical groups look to the party as a <b>totem</b> of the anti austerity movement.</i>
<b>triptych</b>	Art consisting of a painting or carving (especially an altarpiece) on three panels (usually hinged together). <i>His <b>triptych</b> of one act operas is unfairly neglected.</i>
<b>whet</b>	Sharpen by rubbing as on a whetstone. <i>The selection of quotations may <b>whet</b> your curiosity to investigate the source material.</i>
