- *Used to refer to an everlasting or universal spirit, as represented by God.*
- *Seeming to last or persist forever, especially on account of being tedious or annoying.*
- *Lasting or existing forever; without end.*


<b>deathless</b>	Never dying. <i>Pages of <b>deathless</b> prose.</i>
<b>endless</b>	(of a belt, chain, or tape) having the ends joined to form a loop allowing continuous action. <i><b>Endless</b> ocean wastes.</i>
<b>enduring</b>	Lasting over a period of time; durable. <i>An <b>enduring</b> disposition.</i>
<b>eonian</b>	Of or relating to a geological eon (longer than an era).
<b>everlasting</b>	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>The damned would suffer <b>everlasting</b> torment.</i>
<b>immortal</b>	Not subject to death. <i>The <b>immortal</b> children s classic The Wind in the Willows.</i>
<b>immutable</b>	Not subject or susceptible to change or variation in form or quality or nature. <i>The view of that time was that all species were <b>immutable</b> created by God.</i>
<b>imperishable</b>	Not perishable. <i><b>Imperishable</b> truths.</i>
<b>incessant</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Night and day we live with the <b>incessant</b> noise of the city.</i>
<b>indestructible</b>	Not easily destroyed. <i><b>Indestructible</b> plastic containers.</i>
<b>infinite</b>	Of verbs; having neither person nor number nor mood (as a participle or gerund or infinitive). <i>God s <b>infinite</b> wisdom.</i>
<b>interminable</b>	Tiresomely long; seemingly without end. <i>An <b>interminable</b> sermon.</i>
<b>never-ending</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing.
<b>permanent</b>	Lasting or intended to last or remain unchanged indefinitely. <i>Damage was not thought to be <b>permanent</b>.</i>
<b>perpetual</b>	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>Hell s <b>perpetual</b> fires.</i>
<b>persistent</b>	Continuing firmly or obstinately in an opinion or course of action in spite of difficulty or opposition. <i><b>Persistent</b> rain will affect many areas.</i>
<b>relentless</b>	Not to be placated or appeased or moved by entreaty. <i>The <b>relentless</b> heat of the desert.</i>

<b>sustained</b>	Continuing for an extended period or without interruption. <i>Several years of <b>sustained</b> economic growth.</i>
<b><u>timeless</u></b>	Not affected by the passage of time or changes in fashion. <i>Helen s <b>timeless</b> beauty.</i>
<b>unabating</b>	Not weakening or losing intensity. <b><i>Unabating</i></b> enthusiasm.
<b><u>unbroken</u></b>	Not broken, fractured, or damaged. <i>A night of sleep <b>unbroken</b> by nightmares.</i>
<b>unceasing</b>	Not coming to an end; continuous. <i>Man s <b>unceasing</b> warfare with drought and isolation.</i>
<b><u>undying</u></b>	Never dying. <i>Promises of <b>undying</b> love.</i>
<b><u>unending</u></b>	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <b><i>Unending</i></b> demands.
<b>uninterrupted</b>	Continuing in time or space without interruption. <i>Moving midweek holidays to the nearest Monday or Friday allows <b>uninterrupted</b> work weeks.</i>

Never dying.

*His **undying** fame.*

**unlimited**

Having no limits in range or scope.

*To start with a theory of **unlimited** freedom is to end up with **unlimited** despotism.*

**unremitting**

Never relaxing or slackening; incessant.

***Unremitting** demands of hunger.*
