<b>for always</b>	At all times; all the time and on every occasion.
<b>for ever and ever</b>	At all times; all the time and on every occasion.
<b>for good</b>	In a good or proper or satisfactory manner or to a high standard (`good' is a nonstandard dialectal variant for `well).
<b>for good and all</b>	In a good or proper or satisfactory manner or to a high standard (`good' is a nonstandard dialectal variant for `well).
<b><u>forever</u></b>	For all future time; for always. <i>It took <b>forever</b> to get a passport.</i>
<b>in perpetuity</b>	To or toward the inside of.
<b>permanently</b>	In a way that lasts or remains unchanged indefinitely; for all time. <i>He is <b>permanently</b> disabled.</i>
<b>perpetually</b>	Without interruption. <i>She seems <b>perpetually</b> to have a mournful look on her face.</i>
<b>persistently</b>	With persistence. <i>Prices have remained <b>persistently</b> high.</i>
<b><u>regularly</u></b>	At uniform intervals of time. <i>The person who <b>regularly</b> cuts your hair.</i>
<b>repeatedly</b>	Several time. <i>They have been warned <b>repeatedly</b> with no effect.</i>

<u><b>extant</b></u>	Still in existence; not extinct or destroyed or lost- Edward Clodd. <i>An <b>extant</b> letter.</i>
<u><b>forever</b></u>	For a limitless time- P.P.Bliss. <i>These puppies need a <b>forever</b> home.</i>
<b>heretofore</b>	Before now. <i>Diseases that <b>heretofore</b> were usually confined to rural areas.</i>
<b>immortality</b>	The quality of deserving to be remembered for a long time; timelessness. <i>Eating the fruit gave the gods <b>immortality</b>.</i>
<b>immortalize</b>	Be or provide a memorial to a person or an event. <i>He will be forever <b>immortalized</b> in the history books.</i>
<u><b>incarnation</b></u>	The form taken by a person or thing during an incarnation. <i>The <b>incarnation</b> of evil.</i>
<b>incessant</b>	(of something regarded as unpleasant) continuing without pause or interruption. <i>The <b>incessant</b> beat of the music.</i>
<b>incessantly</b>	Without interruption; constantly. <i>She talked about him <b>incessantly</b>.</i>
<u><b>lifelong</b></u>	Continuing through life. <i>The two men were to remain <b>lifelong</b> friends.</i>

<b>live</b>	Be alive at a specified time. <i>They <b>lived</b> with his grandparents.</i>
<b><u>living</u></b>	Of a place used for living rather than working in. <i>Streams of <b>living</b> water.</i>
<b><u>longevity</u></b>	Long life. <i>Her <b>longevity</b> as a star.</i>
<b>permanence</b>	The state or quality of lasting or remaining unchanged indefinitely. <i>The clarity and <b>permanence</b> of the dyes.</i>
<b><u>permanent</u></b>	A perm for the hair. <i><b>Permanent</b> brain damage.</i>
<b>permanently</b>	In a way that lasts or remains unchanged indefinitely; for all time. <i>We need to be <b>permanently</b> vigilant.</i>
<b>perpetual</b>	Denoting or having a position, job, or trophy held for life. <i>A <b>perpetual</b> bond.</i>
<b><u>perpetuity</u></b>	A restriction making an interest in land inalienable perpetually or for a period beyond certain limits fixed by law. <i>He did not believe in the <b>perpetuity</b> of military rule.</i>
