delicate	Difficult to handle; requiring great tact. A delicate flavor.

elegant	Refined and tasteful in appearance or behavior or style. An elegant comfortable house.
elysian	Relating to the Elysian Fields. An elysian meal.
exquisite	Highly sensitive or discriminating. Her exquisite face.
gossamer	Characterized by unusual lightness and delicacy. Gossamer shading through his playing.
graceful	Characterized by beauty of movement, style, form, or execution. She was a tall girl slender and graceful .
heavenly	Of or relating to the sky. Heavenly Father.
holy	Morally and spiritually excellent. I do not lead a holy life.
lovely	Very pleasant or enjoyable; delightful. Lovely views.
spiritual	Having a relationship based on a profound level of mental or emotional communion. He never forgot his spiritual father.
sublime	Producing an overwhelming sense of awe or other high emotion through being vast or grand. The sublime beauty of the night.
supernal	Relating to the sky or the heavens; celestial. Supernal erudition.
unearthly	Unnatural or mysterious, especially in a disturbing way. He could hear the unearthly scream of some curlew piercing the din.

aerial

Coming or carried out from the air, especially using aircraft.
Aerial roots of a philodendron.

angelic

(of a person) exceptionally beautiful, innocent, or kind.
Angelic beneficence.

antenna	Sensitivity similar to that of a receptor organ. <i>A TV antenna.</i>
atmosphere	The pervading tone or mood of a place, situation, or creative work. <i>Part of the sun's energy is absorbed by the earth's atmosphere.</i>
aurora	A natural electrical phenomenon characterized by the appearance of streamers of reddish or greenish light in the sky especially near the northern or southern magnetic pole. The effect is caused by the interaction of charged particles from the sun with atoms in the upper atmosphere. In northern and southern regions it is respectively called aurora borealis or Northern Lights and aurora australis or Southern Lights.
beatific	Feeling or expressing blissful happiness. <i>Beatific peace.</i>
celestial	Positioned in or relating to the sky, or outer space as observed in astronomy. <i>A celestial body.</i>
cherubic	Having the innocence or plump prettiness of a young child. <i>A cherubic face.</i>
cosmic	Inconceivably extended in space or time. <i>The song is a masterpiece of cosmic proportions.</i>
divine	Resulting from divine providence. <i>Divine liturgy.</i>
firmament	The apparent surface of the imaginary sphere on which celestial bodies appear to be projected. <i>Thunder shakes the firmament.</i>
fragile	Vulnerably delicate. <i>Fragile items such as glass and china.</i>
heaven	A state of being eternally in the presence of God after death. <i>Galileo used a telescope to observe the heavens.</i>
heavenly	Of heaven; divine. <i>It was a heavenly morning for a ride.</i>
hemisphere	A half of the celestial sphere. <i>The left hemisphere plays a dominant role in the comprehension of language.</i>
ideal	Conforming to an ultimate standard of perfection or excellence embodying an ideal. <i>Tolerance and freedom the liberal ideals.</i>

<u>immaterial</u>	(often followed by `to') lacking importance; not mattering one way or the other. Immaterial apparitions.
insubstantial	Lacking solidity or strength. <i>The huts are relatively few and insubstantial.</i>
<u>irrelevant</u>	Not connected with or relevant to something. Irrelevant allegations.
light	Having a considerable or sufficient amount of natural light not dark. <i>Turn right at the lights.</i>
<u>paradise</u>	The abode of righteous souls after death. <i>Martyrs who die in battle with the ungodly earn instant transmission to paradise.</i>
radio	An apparatus for receiving radio programmes. <i>Cellular phones are linked by radio rather than wires.</i>
sacred	Regarded as too valuable to be interfered with; sacrosanct. <i>Saw motherhood as woman s sacred calling.</i>
saintly	Relating to a saint. <i>A crypt for some saintly relic.</i>
seraphic	Characteristic of or resembling a seraph or seraphim; angelic. <i>He imagined a seraphic presence in the room.</i>
<u>sky</u>	The atmosphere and outer space as viewed from the earth. <i>Hundreds of stars were shining in the sky.</i>
supernal	Of heaven or the spirit. <i>He is the supernal poet of our age.</i>
<u>unimportant</u>	Lacking in importance or significance. <i>The question seems unimportant.</i>
unsubstantial	Having little or no solidity, reality, or factual basis. <i>A pretty if unsubstantial cubist composition.</i>
welkin	The apparent surface of the imaginary sphere on which celestial bodies appear to be projected.
