<b>anthropological</b>	Relating to the study of humankind. <i>An <b>anthropological</b> expedition to Borneo.</i>
<a href="#"><b>anthropology</b></a>	The study of human societies and cultures and their development.
<b>caste</b>	The system of dividing society into castes. <i>A man of high <b>caste</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><b>civilian</b></a>	Relating to civilians. <i><b>Civilian</b> life.</i>
<a href="#"><b>colonialism</b></a>	Exploitation by a stronger country of weaker one; the use of the weaker country's resources to strengthen and enrich the stronger country. <i>The state apparatus that was dominant under <b>colonialism</b>.</i>
<b>community</b>	The condition of sharing or having certain attitudes and interests in common. <i>The news spread rapidly through the medical <b>community</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><b>country</b></a>	The people who live in a nation or country. <i>The whole <b>country</b> worshipped him.</i>
<b>cultural</b>	Relating to the ideas, customs, and social behaviour of a society. <i>A <b>cultural</b> festival.</i>
<b>ethnic</b>	A member of an ethnic minority. <i><b>Ethnic</b> jewellery.</i>
<b>ethnocentrism</b>	Belief in the superiority of one's own ethnic group.
<b>ethnographic</b>	Relating to the scientific description of peoples and cultures with their customs, habits, and mutual differences. <i><b>Ethnographic</b> research in European border communities.</i>
<b>ethnography</b>	The scientific description of peoples and cultures with their customs, habits, and mutual differences.

<b>ethnology</b>	The branch of anthropology that deals with the division of humankind into races and with their origins and distribution and distinctive characteristics.
<b>exotic</b>	An exotic plant or animal. <i>The <b>exotic</b> landscape of a dead planet.</i>
<b>folklore</b>	A body of popular myths or beliefs relating to a particular place, activity, or group of people. <i>Hollywood <b>folklore</b>.</i>
<b>gorilla</b>	A dominant contender within a particular sphere of operation or activity. <i>The 800 lb <b>gorilla</b> of the home mortgage industry.</i>
<a href="#"><u>hierarchy</u></a>	The organization of people at different ranks in an administrative body. <i>The trend is to get away from <b>hierarchy</b> and control.</i>
<b>humanity</b>	The quality of being humane; benevolence. <i>Our differences matter but our common <b>humanity</b> matters more.</i>
<b>humankind</b>	All of the living human inhabitants of the earth. <i>The origin of <b>humankind</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>local</u></a>	A local branch of an organization especially a trade union. <i>The <b>local</b> seemed to take forever to get to New York.</i>
<b>mankind</b>	All of the living human inhabitants of the earth. <i>She always used <b>humankind</b> because <b>mankind</b> seemed to slight the women.</i>
<b>miscegenation</b>	The interbreeding of people considered to be of different racial types. <i>They believe in <b>miscegenation</b> as the answer to world peace.</i>
<a href="#"><u>national</u></a>	A national newspaper as opposed to a local one. <i>This policy may have been in the <b>national</b> interest.</i>
<b>nationalism</b>	The doctrine that nations should act independently (rather than collectively) to attain their goals. <i>British <b>nationalism</b> was in the air and patriotic sentiments ran high.</i>
<b>nationality</b>	The status of belonging to a particular nation by birth or naturalization. <i>Men of Spanish <b>nationality</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>patriotism</u></a>	The quality of being patriotic; devotion to and vigorous support for one's country. <i>They rode the same wave of popular <b>patriotism</b>.</i>
<b>people</b>	Of a group of people inhabit a place. <i>I ve had my <b>people</b> watching the house for some time now.</i>
<b>racism</b>	The prejudice that members of one race are intrinsically superior to members of other races. <i>Theories of <b>racism</b>.</i>

**tradition**

An artistic or literary method or style established by an artist, writer, or movement, and subsequently followed by others.

*Visionary works in the **tradition** of William Blake.*

**xenophobia**

A fear of foreigners or strangers.
