- *A feeling of great (usually exaggerated) elation.*



Synonyms of "Euphoria" as a noun (12 Words)

<u>animation</u>	The manipulation of electronic images by means of a computer in order to create moving images. <i>Animations as backdrops for live action.</i>
delight	A cause or source of great pleasure. <i>His delight to see her was obvious to all.</i>
<u>elation</u>	Great happiness and exhilaration. <i>Richard's elation at regaining his health was short lived.</i>
euphory	A feeling of great (usually exaggerated) elation.
excitement	Something that arouses a feeling of excitement. <i>The excitements of the previous night.</i>
<u>exhilaration</u>	The feeling of lively and cheerful joy. <i>They felt the exhilaration of victory.</i>
exultation	A feeling of triumphant elation or jubilation; rejoicing. <i>She laughs in exultation.</i>

glee

Malicious satisfaction.

*His face lit up with impish **glee**.*

happiness

State of well-being characterized by emotions ranging from contentment to intense joy.

*Tom's heart swelled with **happiness**.*

joy

A thing that causes joy.

*A **joy** to behold.*

joyousness

The emotion of great happiness.

jubilation

The utterance of sounds expressing great joy.

*Unbelievable scenes of **jubilation**.*



Usage Examples of "Euphoria" as a noun

- *In his euphoria, he had become convinced he could defeat them.*



Associations of "Euphoria" (30 Words)

beatitude	The blessings listed by Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount (Matt. 5:3-11). <i>The expression of beatitude the religious sometimes adopt.</i>
blessedness	A state of supreme happiness.
<u>bliss</u>	Perfect happiness; great joy. <i>Blissed out hippies.</i>
<u>contentment</u>	Happiness with one's situation in life. <i>He found contentment in living a simple life in the country.</i>
delectation	Pleasure and delight. <i>They had all manner of rock n roll goodies for our delectation.</i>
delight	Take delight in. <i>They delight in playing tricks.</i>
delighted	Feeling or showing great pleasure. <i>We were delighted to see her.</i>

<u>ecstasy</u>	A state of being carried away by overwhelming emotion- Charles Dickens. <i>There was a look of ecstasy on his face.</i>
<u>ecstatic</u>	A person subject to mystical experiences. <i>An ecstatic vision of God.</i>
elated	Ecstatically happy. <i>After the concert I felt elated.</i>
enjoy	Derive or receive pleasure from get enjoyment from take pleasure in. <i>I could never enjoy myself knowing you were in your room alone.</i>
enjoyable	Affording satisfaction or pleasure. <i>The company was enjoyable.</i>
<u>enraptured</u>	Feeling great rapture or delight.
exaltation	A feeling or state of extreme happiness. <i>She was in a frenzy of exaltation and terror.</i>
exult	Feel or show triumphant elation or jubilation. <i>Exulting in her escape Lisa closed the door behind her.</i>
exultant	Triumphantly happy. <i>He waved to the exultant crowds.</i>
felicity	Pleasing and appropriate manner or style (especially manner or style of expression). <i>Domestic felicity.</i>
festal	Relating to or characteristic of a celebration or festival. <i>A festive or festal occasion.</i>
<u>glad</u>	Causing happiness. <i>A glad smile.</i>
gladness	Experiencing joy and pleasure.
happiness	The state of being happy. <i>Tom s heart swelled with happiness.</i>
happy	Used in greetings. <i>A happy smile.</i>
<u>jolly</u>	A yawl used by a ship's sailors for general work. <i>Idea to jolly up a winter s party.</i>
joy	A thing that causes joy. <i>Tears of joy.</i>
<u>joyous</u>	Full of happiness and joy. <i>Felt a joyous abandon.</i>
<u>pleased</u>	Willing or glad to do something. <i>We will be pleased to provide an independent appraisal.</i>

pleasure	Sensual gratification. <i>The touch of his fingers gave her such pleasure.</i>
rapt	Filled with an intense and pleasurable emotion enraptured. <i>The newly chosen minister declared he was rapt with his new portfolio.</i>
rapture	A state of being carried away by overwhelming emotion. <i>People will be raptured out of automobiles as they are driving along.</i>
satisfaction	Compensation for a wrong. <i>I looked round with satisfaction.</i>
