- *A feeling or state of intense excitement and happiness.*
- *A feeling of great (usually exaggerated) elation.*



## Synonyms of "Euphoria" as a noun (12 Words)

- animation** The manipulation of electronic images by means of a computer in order to create moving images.  
*Animations as backdrops for live action.*
- delight** A cause or source of great pleasure.  
*His **delight** to see her was obvious to all.*
- elation** Great happiness and exhilaration.  
*Richard's **elation** at regaining his health was short lived.*
- euphory** A feeling of great (usually exaggerated) elation.
- excitement** Something that arouses a feeling of excitement.  
*The **excitements** of the previous night.*
- exhilaration** The feeling of lively and cheerful joy.  
*They felt the **exhilaration** of victory.*
- exultation** A feeling of triumphant elation or jubilation; rejoicing.  
*She laughs in **exultation**.*

<b>glee</b>	Malicious satisfaction. <i>His face lit up with impish <b>glee</b>.</i>
<b>happiness</b>	State of well-being characterized by emotions ranging from contentment to intense joy. <i>Tom s heart swelled with <b>happiness</b>.</i>
<b>joy</b>	A thing that causes joy. <i>A <b>joy</b> to behold.</i>
<b>joyousness</b>	The emotion of great happiness.
<b>jubilation</b>	The utterance of sounds expressing great joy. <i>Unbelievable scenes of <b>jubilation</b>.</i>



### Usage Examples of "Euphoria" as a noun

- *In his euphoria, he had become convinced he could defeat them.*

- beatitude** The blessings listed by Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount (Matt. 5:3-11).  
*The expression of **beatitude** the religious sometimes adopt.*
- blessedness** A state of supreme happiness.
- bliss** Perfect happiness; great joy.  
***Blissed** out hippies.*
- contentment** Happiness with one's situation in life.  
*He found **contentment** in living a simple life in the country.*
- delectation** Pleasure and delight.  
*They had all manner of rock n roll goodies for our **delectation**.*
- delight** Take delight in.  
*They **delight** in playing tricks.*
- delighted** Feeling or showing great pleasure.  
*We were **delighted** to see her.*

<b>ecstasy</b>	A state of being carried away by overwhelming emotion- Charles Dickens. <i>There was a look of <b>ecstasy</b> on his face.</i>
<b>ecstatic</b>	A person subject to mystical experiences. <i>An <b>ecstatic</b> vision of God.</i>
<b>elated</b>	Ecstatically happy. <i>After the concert I felt <b>elated</b>.</i>
<b>enjoy</b>	Derive or receive pleasure from get enjoyment from take pleasure in. <i>I could never <b>enjoy</b> myself knowing you were in your room alone.</i>
<b>enjoyable</b>	Affording satisfaction or pleasure. <i>The company was <b>enjoyable</b>.</i>
<b>enraptured</b>	Feeling great rapture or delight.
<b>exaltation</b>	A feeling or state of extreme happiness. <i>She was in a frenzy of <b>exaltation</b> and terror.</i>
<b>exult</b>	Feel or show triumphant elation or jubilation. <i><b>Exulting</b> in her escape Lisa closed the door behind her.</i>
<b>exultant</b>	Triumphantly happy. <i>He waved to the <b>exultant</b> crowds.</i>
<b>felicity</b>	Pleasing and appropriate manner or style (especially manner or style of expression). <i>Domestic <b>felicity</b>.</i>
<b>festal</b>	Relating to or characteristic of a celebration or festival. <i>A festive or <b>festal</b> occasion.</i>
<b>glad</b>	Causing happiness. <i>A <b>glad</b> smile.</i>
<b>gladness</b>	Experiencing joy and pleasure.
<b>happiness</b>	The state of being happy. <i>Tom s heart swelled with <b>happiness</b>.</i>
<b>happy</b>	Used in greetings. <i>A <b>happy</b> smile.</i>
<b>jolly</b>	A yawl used by a ship's sailors for general work. <i>Idea to <b>jolly</b> up a winter s party.</i>
<b>joy</b>	A thing that causes joy. <i>Tears of <b>joy</b>.</i>
<b>joyous</b>	Full of happiness and joy. <i>Felt a <b>joyous</b> abandon.</i>
<b>pleased</b>	Willing or glad to do something. <i>We will be <b>pleased</b> to provide an independent appraisal.</i>

- pleasure** Sensual gratification.  
*The touch of his fingers gave her such **pleasure**.*
- rapt** Filled with an intense and pleasurable emotion enraptured.  
*The newly chosen minister declared he was **rapt** with his new portfolio.*
- rapture** A state of being carried away by overwhelming emotion.  
*People will be **raptured** out of automobiles as they are driving along.*
- satisfaction** Compensation for a wrong.  
*I looked round with **satisfaction**.*
