<u>ecstatic</u>	Feeling or expressing overwhelming happiness or joyful excitement. <i>Ecstatic</i> fans filled the stadium.
elated	Full of high-spirited delight. Felt <b>elated</b> and excited.
<u>enraptured</u>	Feeling great rapture or delight.
excited	Very enthusiastic and eager. They were <b>excited</b> about the prospect.



exhilarated	Very happy, animated, or elated. The sun and the wind on his back made him feel <b>exhilarated</b> happy to be alive.
exultant	Joyful and proud especially because of triumph or success. <i>He waved to the <b>exultant</b> crowds.</i>
<u>gleeful</u>	Exuberantly or triumphantly joyful. She gave a <b>gleeful</b> chuckle.
happy	Fortunate and convenient. Melissa came in looking <b>happy</b> and excited.
in heaven	Holding office.
in paradise	Currently fashionable.
in rhapsodies	Currently fashionable.
in seventh heaver	<b>n</b> Directed or bound inward.
<b>intoxicated</b>	Drunk or under the influence of drugs. A noisy crowd of <b>intoxicated</b> sailors.
<u>joyful</u>	Full of or producing joy. A <b>joyful</b> heart.
<u>joyous</u>	Full of happiness and joy. Felt a <b>joyous</b> abandon.
jubilant	Joyful and proud especially because of triumph or success. A large number of <b>jubilant</b> fans ran on to the pitch.
rapturous	Characterized by, feeling, or expressing great pleasure or enthusiasm. <i>He was greeted with <b>rapturous</b> applause.</i>
rhapsodic	Feeling great rapture or delight.

beatitude	A title given to patriarchs in the Orthodox Church. <i>The expression of</i> <b>beatitude</b> <i>the religious sometimes adopt.</i>
blessedness	The state of being blessed with divine favour.
<u>bliss</u>	Perfect happiness; great joy. <i>Bliss</i> ed out hippies.
<u>blissful</u>	Providing perfect happiness or great joy. In <b>blissful</b> ignorance.



<u>contentment</u>	Happiness with one's situation in life. <i>He found <b>contentment</b> in living a simple life in the country.</i>
delighted	Greatly pleased. A <b>delighted</b> smile.
<u>delightful</u>	Causing delight; charming. A <b>delightful</b> surprise.
<u>ecstatic</u>	A person subject to mystical experiences. An <b>ecstatic</b> vision of God.
elated	Ecstatically happy. Felt <b>elated</b> and excited.
enjoyable	Affording satisfaction or pleasure. The company was <b>enjoyable</b> .
<u>enraptured</u>	Feeling great rapture or delight.
<u>euphoria</u>	A feeling of great (usually exaggerated) elation. In his <b>euphoria</b> he had become convinced he could defeat them.
exaltation	The elevation of a person (as to the status of a god. The <b>exaltation</b> of the army as a place for brotherhood.
<u>expansive</u>	Tending towards economic or political expansion. <i>He was in an <b>expansive</b> mood.</i>
exultant	Joyful and proud especially because of triumph or success. <i>He waved to the <b>exultant</b> crowds.</i>
exultation	A feeling of extreme joy. She laughs in <b>exultation</b> .
<u>glad</u>	Cheerful and bright. <i>Glad</i> that they succeeded.
happy	Marked by good fortune. Melissa came in looking <b>happy</b> and excited.
<u>joyful</u>	Full of or producing joy. <i>Joyful music.</i>
<u>joyous</u>	Full of or characterized by joy. <i>Joyous</i> laughter.
jubilant	Feeling or expressing great happiness and triumph. A large number of <b>jubilant</b> fans ran on to the pitch.
laughing	Showing or feeling mirth or pleasure or happiness. <i>Laughing</i> children.
<u>merry</u>	(of an occasion or season) characterized by festivity and enjoyment. A <i>merry</i> evening.



<u>pleased</u>	Feeling or showing pleasure and satisfaction, especially at an event or a situation. Both girls were <b>pleased</b> with their new hairstyles.
<u>pleasurable</u>	Pleasing; enjoyable. I arrived in a mood of <b>pleasurable</b> anticipation.
rapture	A state of elated bliss. The tabloids went into <b>rapture</b> s about her.
rapturous	Characterized by, feeling, or expressing great pleasure or enthusiasm. <i>He was greeted with</i> <b><i>rapturous</i></b> <i>applause</i> .
rejoicing	A feeling of great happiness. <b>Rejoicing</b> crowds filled the streets on VJ Day.
satisfactorily	In a way that fulfils expectations or needs; acceptably. The matter is considered to be <b>satisfactorily</b> resolved.
smiling	Smiling with happiness or optimism. A room of <b>smiling</b> faces.
