exultation A feeling of extreme joy.

She laughs in **exultation**.

Cheerful and bright.

Glad that they succeeded.

Marked by good fortune.

Melissa came in looking happy and excited.

joyful Full of or producing joy.

Joyful music.

Full of or characterized by joy.

Joyous laughter.

jubilant Feeling or expressing great happiness and triumph. A large number of **jubilant** fans ran on to the pitch.

Showing or feeling mirth or pleasure or happiness.

laughing Laughing children.

(of an occasion or season) characterized by festivity and enjoyment.
