<u>blissful</u>	Completely happy and contented. <i>In blissful ignorance.</i>
delighted	Filled with wonder and delight. <i>We were delighted to see her.</i>
<u>ecstatic</u>	Feeling or expressing overwhelming happiness or joyful excitement. <i>Ecstatic fans filled the stadium.</i>
elated	Full of high-spirited delight. <i>Felt elated and excited.</i>
<u>enraptured</u>	Feeling great rapture or delight.
excited	Very enthusiastic and eager. <i>They were excited about the prospect.</i>

exhilarated	Very happy, animated, or elated. <i>The sun and the wind on his back made him feel exhilarated happy to be alive.</i>
exultant	Joyful and proud especially because of triumph or success. <i>He waved to the exultant crowds.</i>
gleeful	Exuberantly or triumphantly joyful. <i>She gave a gleeful chuckle.</i>
happy	Fortunate and convenient. <i>Melissa came in looking happy and excited.</i>
in heaven	Holding office.
in paradise	Currently fashionable.
in rhapsodies	Currently fashionable.
in seventh heaven	Directed or bound inward.
intoxicated	Drunk or under the influence of drugs. <i>A noisy crowd of intoxicated sailors.</i>
joyful	Full of or producing joy. <i>A joyful heart.</i>
joyous	Full of happiness and joy. <i>Felt a joyous abandon.</i>
jubilant	Joyful and proud especially because of triumph or success. <i>A large number of jubilant fans ran on to the pitch.</i>
rapturous	Characterized by, feeling, or expressing great pleasure or enthusiasm. <i>He was greeted with rapturous applause.</i>
rhapsodic	Feeling great rapture or delight.

beatitude	A title given to patriarchs in the Orthodox Church. <i>The expression of beatitude the religious sometimes adopt.</i>
blessedness	The state of being blessed with divine favour.
<u>bliss</u>	Perfect happiness; great joy. <i>Blissed out hippies.</i>
<u>blissful</u>	Providing perfect happiness or great joy. <i>In blissful ignorance.</i>

<u>contentment</u>	Happiness with one's situation in life. <i>He found contentment in living a simple life in the country.</i>
delighted	Greatly pleased. <i>A delighted smile.</i>
<u>delightful</u>	Causing delight; charming. <i>A delightful surprise.</i>
<u>ecstatic</u>	A person subject to mystical experiences. <i>An ecstatic vision of God.</i>
elated	Ecstatically happy. <i>Felt elated and excited.</i>
enjoyable	Affording satisfaction or pleasure. <i>The company was enjoyable.</i>
<u>enraptured</u>	Feeling great rapture or delight.
<u>euphoria</u>	A feeling of great (usually exaggerated) elation. <i>In his euphoria he had become convinced he could defeat them.</i>
exaltation	The elevation of a person (as to the status of a god). <i>The exaltation of the army as a place for brotherhood.</i>
<u>expansive</u>	Tending towards economic or political expansion. <i>He was in an expansive mood.</i>
exultant	Joyful and proud especially because of triumph or success. <i>He waved to the exultant crowds.</i>
exultation	A feeling of extreme joy. <i>She laughs in exultation.</i>
<u>glad</u>	Cheerful and bright. <i>Glad that they succeeded.</i>
happy	Marked by good fortune. <i>Melissa came in looking happy and excited.</i>
<u>joyful</u>	Full of or producing joy. <i>Joyful music.</i>
<u>joyous</u>	Full of or characterized by joy. <i>Joyous laughter.</i>
jubilant	Feeling or expressing great happiness and triumph. <i>A large number of jubilant fans ran on to the pitch.</i>
laughing	Showing or feeling mirth or pleasure or happiness. <i>Laughing children.</i>
<u>merry</u>	(of an occasion or season) characterized by festivity and enjoyment. <i>A merry evening.</i>

<u>pleased</u>	Feeling or showing pleasure and satisfaction, especially at an event or a situation. <i>Both girls were pleased with their new hairstyles.</i>
<u>pleasurable</u>	Pleasing; enjoyable. <i>I arrived in a mood of pleasurable anticipation.</i>
rapture	A state of elated bliss. <i>The tabloids went into raptures about her.</i>
rapturous	Characterized by, feeling, or expressing great pleasure or enthusiasm. <i>He was greeted with rapturous applause.</i>
rejoicing	A feeling of great happiness. <i>Rejoicing crowds filled the streets on VJ Day.</i>
satisfactorily	In a way that fulfils expectations or needs; acceptably. <i>The matter is considered to be satisfactorily resolved.</i>
smiling	Smiling with happiness or optimism. <i>A room of smiling faces.</i>
