<b><u>blissful</u></b>	Completely happy and contented. <i>In <b>blissful</b> ignorance.</i>
<b>delighted</b>	Filled with wonder and delight. <i>We were <b>delighted</b> to see her.</i>
<b><u>ecstatic</u></b>	Feeling or expressing overwhelming happiness or joyful excitement. <i><b>Ecstatic</b> fans filled the stadium.</i>
<b>elated</b>	Full of high-spirited delight. <i>Felt <b>elated</b> and excited.</i>
<b><u>enraptured</u></b>	Feeling great rapture or delight.
<b>excited</b>	Very enthusiastic and eager. <i>They were <b>excited</b> about the prospect.</i>

<b>exhilarated</b>	Very happy, animated, or elated. <i>The sun and the wind on his back made him feel <b>exhilarated</b> happy to be alive.</i>
<b>exultant</b>	Joyful and proud especially because of triumph or success. <i>He waved to the <b>exultant</b> crowds.</i>
<b>gleeful</b>	Exuberantly or triumphantly joyful. <i>She gave a <b>gleeful</b> chuckle.</i>
<b>happy</b>	Fortunate and convenient. <i>Melissa came in looking <b>happy</b> and excited.</i>
<b>in heaven</b>	Holding office.
<b>in paradise</b>	Currently fashionable.
<b>in rhapsodies</b>	Currently fashionable.
<b>in seventh heaven</b>	Directed or bound inward.
<b>intoxicated</b>	Drunk or under the influence of drugs. <i>A noisy crowd of <b>intoxicated</b> sailors.</i>
<b>joyful</b>	Full of or producing joy. <i>A <b>joyful</b> heart.</i>
<b>joyous</b>	Full of happiness and joy. <i>Felt a <b>joyous</b> abandon.</i>
<b>jubilant</b>	Joyful and proud especially because of triumph or success. <i>A large number of <b>jubilant</b> fans ran on to the pitch.</i>
<b>rapturous</b>	Characterized by, feeling, or expressing great pleasure or enthusiasm. <i>He was greeted with <b>rapturous</b> applause.</i>
<b>rhapsodic</b>	Feeling great rapture or delight.

## Associations of "Euphoric" (30 Words)

<b>beatitude</b>	A title given to patriarchs in the Orthodox Church. <i>The expression of <b>beatitude</b> the religious sometimes adopt.</i>
<b>blessedness</b>	The state of being blessed with divine favour.
<b><u>bliss</u></b>	Perfect happiness; great joy. <i><b>Blissed</b> out hippies.</i>
<b><u>blissful</u></b>	Providing perfect happiness or great joy. <i>In <b>blissful</b> ignorance.</i>

<b><u>contentment</u></b>	Happiness with one's situation in life. <i>He found <b>contentment</b> in living a simple life in the country.</i>
<b>delighted</b>	Greatly pleased. <i>A <b>delighted</b> smile.</i>
<b><u>delightful</u></b>	Causing delight; charming. <i>A <b>delightful</b> surprise.</i>
<b><u>ecstatic</u></b>	A person subject to mystical experiences. <i>An <b>ecstatic</b> vision of God.</i>
<b>elated</b>	Ecstatically happy. <i>Felt <b>elated</b> and excited.</i>
<b>enjoyable</b>	Affording satisfaction or pleasure. <i>The company was <b>enjoyable</b>.</i>
<b><u>enraptured</u></b>	Feeling great rapture or delight.
<b><u>euphoria</u></b>	A feeling of great (usually exaggerated) elation. <i>In his <b>euphoria</b> he had become convinced he could defeat them.</i>
<b>exaltation</b>	The elevation of a person (as to the status of a god). <i>The <b>exaltation</b> of the army as a place for brotherhood.</i>
<b><u>expansive</u></b>	Tending towards economic or political expansion. <i>He was in an <b>expansive</b> mood.</i>
<b>exultant</b>	Joyful and proud especially because of triumph or success. <i>He waved to the <b>exultant</b> crowds.</i>
<b>exultation</b>	A feeling of extreme joy. <i>She laughs in <b>exultation</b>.</i>
<b><u>glad</u></b>	Cheerful and bright. <i><b>Glad</b> that they succeeded.</i>
<b>happy</b>	Marked by good fortune. <i>Melissa came in looking <b>happy</b> and excited.</i>
<b><u>joyful</u></b>	Full of or producing joy. <i><b>Joyful</b> music.</i>
<b><u>joyous</u></b>	Full of or characterized by joy. <i><b>Joyous</b> laughter.</i>
<b>jubilant</b>	Feeling or expressing great happiness and triumph. <i>A large number of <b>jubilant</b> fans ran on to the pitch.</i>
<b>laughing</b>	Showing or feeling mirth or pleasure or happiness. <i><b>Laughing</b> children.</i>
<b><u>merry</u></b>	(of an occasion or season) characterized by festivity and enjoyment. <i>A <b>merry</b> evening.</i>

<b><u>pleased</u></b>	Feeling or showing pleasure and satisfaction, especially at an event or a situation. <i>Both girls were <b>pleased</b> with their new hairstyles.</i>
<b><u>pleasurable</u></b>	Pleasing; enjoyable. <i>I arrived in a mood of <b>pleasurable</b> anticipation.</i>
<b>rapture</b>	A state of elated bliss. <i>The tabloids went into <b>raptures</b> about her.</i>
<b>rapturous</b>	Characterized by, feeling, or expressing great pleasure or enthusiasm. <i>He was greeted with <b>rapturous</b> applause.</i>
<b>rejoicing</b>	A feeling of great happiness. <i><b>Rejoicing</b> crowds filled the streets on VJ Day.</i>
<b>satisfactorily</b>	In a way that fulfils expectations or needs; acceptably. <i>The matter is considered to be <b>satisfactorily</b> resolved.</i>
<b>smiling</b>	Smiling with happiness or optimism. <i>A room of <b>smiling</b> faces.</i>
