- cognizance** Knowledge or awareness.  
*The Renaissance **cognizance** of Greece was limited.*
- commiserate** To feel or express sympathy or compassion.  
*She did not exult in her rival's fall but on the contrary **commiserated** her.*

<b>comprehend</b>	Include in scope; include as part of something broader; have as one's sphere or territory. <i>I simply couldn't <b>comprehend</b> what had happened.</i>
<b>comprehension</b>	The inclusion of Nonconformists within the Established Church of England (as proposed in the 17th to 19th centuries but not adopted). <b>Comprehension</b> exercises.
<b>construe</b>	Translate (a passage or author) word for word, typically aloud. <i>His words could hardly be <b>construed</b> as an apology.</i>
<b>edify</b>	Instruct or improve (someone) morally or intellectually. <i>Rachel had edified their childhood with frequent readings from Belloc.</i>
<b>empathize</b>	Be understanding of. <i>Counsellors need to be able to <b>empathize</b> with people.</i>
<b>enlighten</b>	Make understand. <i>Can you <b>enlighten</b> me I don't understand this proposal.</i>
<b>enlightened</b>	Characterized by full comprehension of the problem involved. <i>An <b>enlightened</b> electorate.</i>
<b>grasp</b>	The act of grasping. <i>Many companies <b>grasped</b> the opportunity to expand.</i>
<b>intuitively</b>	In an intuitive manner. <i>He knows <b>intuitively</b> how to calm me.</i>
<b>know</b>	Know the nature or character of. <i>We <b>know</b> this movie.</i>
<b>perceivable</b>	Capable of being apprehended or understood. <b>Perceivable</b> through the mist.
<b>perceive</b>	Become aware or conscious of (something); come to realize or understand. <i>Some geographers <b>perceive</b> hydrology to be a separate field of scientific enquiry.</i>
<b>perception</b>	The representation of what is perceived; basic component in the formation of a concept. <i>The <b>perception</b> of pain.</i>
<b>perceptual</b>	Of or relating to the act of perceiving. <i>A patient with <b>perceptual</b> problems who cannot judge distances.</i>
<b>realize</b>	Cause to happen. <i>She <b>realized</b> a profit of 100 000.</i>
<b>recognizable</b>	Able to be recognized or identified from previous encounters or knowledge. <i>This situation produces <b>recognizable</b> stress symptoms.</i>

<b>recognize</b>	Accept (someone) to be what is claimed or accept his power and authority. <i>Countries which <b>recognized</b> East Germany.</i>
<b>savvy</b>	Shrewdness and practical knowledge; the ability to make good judgements. <i>Charley would <b>savvy</b> what to do.</i>
<b>sensate</b>	Having physical sensation. <i>The <b>sensate</b> world.</i>
<b>sensory</b>	Involving or derived from the senses. <i><b>Sensory</b> neurons.</i>
<b>sentience</b>	The faculty through which the external world is apprehended. <i>Gave <b>sentience</b> to slugs and newts.</i>
<b>sympathize</b>	Agree with a sentiment, opinion, or ideology. <i>It is easy to understand and <b>sympathize</b> with his predicament.</i>
<b>understand</b>	Be understanding of. <i>He didn't <b>understand</b> a word I said.</i>
<b>understandable</b>	Able to be understood. <i>It is <b>understandable</b> that mistakes occur sometimes.</i>
<b>understanding</b>	Characterized by understanding based on comprehension and discernment and empathy. <i>Foreign visitors with little <b>understanding</b> of English.</i>
