comprehend	Include in scope; include as part of something broader; have as one's sphere or territory. <i>I simply couldn't comprehend what had happened.</i>
comprehension	The inclusion of Nonconformists within the Established Church of England (as proposed in the 17th to 19th centuries but not adopted). Comprehension exercises.
construe	Translate (a passage or author) word for word, typically aloud. <i>His words could hardly be construed as an apology.</i>
edify	Instruct or improve (someone) morally or intellectually. <i>Rachel had edified their childhood with frequent readings from Belloc.</i>
empathize	Be understanding of. <i>Counsellors need to be able to empathize with people.</i>
enlighten	Make understand. <i>Can you enlighten me I don't understand this proposal.</i>
enlightened	Characterized by full comprehension of the problem involved. <i>An enlightened electorate.</i>
grasp	The act of grasping. <i>Many companies grasped the opportunity to expand.</i>
intuitively	In an intuitive manner. <i>He knows intuitively how to calm me.</i>
know	Know the nature or character of. <i>We know this movie.</i>
perceivable	Capable of being apprehended or understood. Perceivable through the mist.
perceive	Become aware or conscious of (something); come to realize or understand. <i>Some geographers perceive hydrology to be a separate field of scientific enquiry.</i>
perception	The representation of what is perceived; basic component in the formation of a concept. <i>The perception of pain.</i>
perceptual	Of or relating to the act of perceiving. <i>A patient with perceptual problems who cannot judge distances.</i>
realize	Cause to happen. <i>She realized a profit of 100 000.</i>
recognizable	Able to be recognized or identified from previous encounters or knowledge. <i>This situation produces recognizable stress symptoms.</i>

recognize	Accept (someone) to be what is claimed or accept his power and authority. <i>Countries which recognized East Germany.</i>
savvy	Shrewdness and practical knowledge; the ability to make good judgements. <i>Charley would savvy what to do.</i>
sensate	Having physical sensation. <i>The sensate world.</i>
sensory	Involving or derived from the senses. <i>Sensory neurons.</i>
sentience	The faculty through which the external world is apprehended. <i>Gave sentience to slugs and newts.</i>
sympathize	Agree with a sentiment, opinion, or ideology. <i>It is easy to understand and sympathize with his predicament.</i>
understand	Be understanding of. <i>He didn't understand a word I said.</i>
understandable	Able to be understood. <i>It is understandable that mistakes occur sometimes.</i>
understanding	Characterized by understanding based on comprehension and discernment and empathy. <i>Foreign visitors with little understanding of English.</i>
