diatonic	Of a melody or harmony constructed from a diatonic scale.
dispassion	Lack of strong emotion or personal feelings. <i>Try to look upon the war with dispassion and detachment.</i>
dispassionate	Unaffected by strong emotion or prejudice. <i>She dealt with life s disasters in a calm dispassionate way.</i>
equilibrium	A situation in which supply and demand are matched and prices stable. <i>The equilibrium level of income.</i>
equipoise	Balance of forces or interests. <i>This temporary equipoise of power.</i>
equitable	Fair to all parties as dictated by reason and conscience. <i>The beneficiaries have an equitable interest in the property.</i>
<u>equity</u>	A branch of law that developed alongside common law and is concerned with fairness and justice, formerly administered in special courts. <i>He owns 62 of the group s equity.</i>

evenhanded	Without partiality. <i>Evenhanded justice.</i>
fair	Without favoring one party in a fair evenhanded manner. <i>Today will be fair and warm.</i>
impartial	Showing lack of favoritism. <i>The minister cannot be impartial in the way that a judge would be.</i>
impartiality	Equal treatment of all rivals or disputants; fairness. <i>Entries had to be submitted under a pseudonym to ensure impartiality in the judging process.</i>
<u>justice</u>	A public official authorized to decide questions brought before a court of justice. <i>A concern for justice peace and genuine respect for people.</i>
level	Make level or straight. <i>Level criticism or charges at somebody.</i>
<u>neutral</u>	An electrically neutral point terminal conductor or wire. <i>Neutral soil conditions.</i>
neutrality	The condition of being chemically or electrically neutral. <i>The structure has overall electrical neutrality.</i>
<u>objectivity</u>	Judgment based on observable phenomena and uninfluenced by emotions or personal prejudices. <i>The piece lacked any objectivity.</i>
<u>offset</u>	Produce by offset printing. <i>Donations to charities can be offset against tax.</i>
proportion	Give pleasant proportions to. <i>The bleach can be diluted with water in the proportion one part bleach to ten parts water.</i>
<u>remnant</u>	A piece of cloth left when the greater part has been used or sold. <i>He sat sewing patchwork cushions with all the remnants.</i>
<u>stability</u>	The quality of being enduring and free from change or variation. <i>There are fears for the political stability of the area.</i>
standard	Conforming to or constituting a standard of measurement or value or of the usual or regularized or accepted kind. <i>Half of the beaches fail to comply with European standards.</i>
steadiness	The quality of being steady-regular and unvarying. <i>I admire the steadiness of her hands.</i>
<u>symmetry</u>	Similarity or exact correspondence between different things. <i>The overall symmetry makes the poem pleasant to the ear.</i>
