Definitions of "Evenly" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “evenly” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *In equal numbers, amounts, or values.*
- *Used to indicate a number that is divisible by two without a remainder.*
- *With equal space or time between each; regularly.*
- *In a level and regular way.*
- *With each having an equal chance.*
- *In equal amounts or shares; in a balanced or impartial way.*
- *Calmly and without strong emotion or variation.*
- *So as to present a flat or uniform surface or line.*



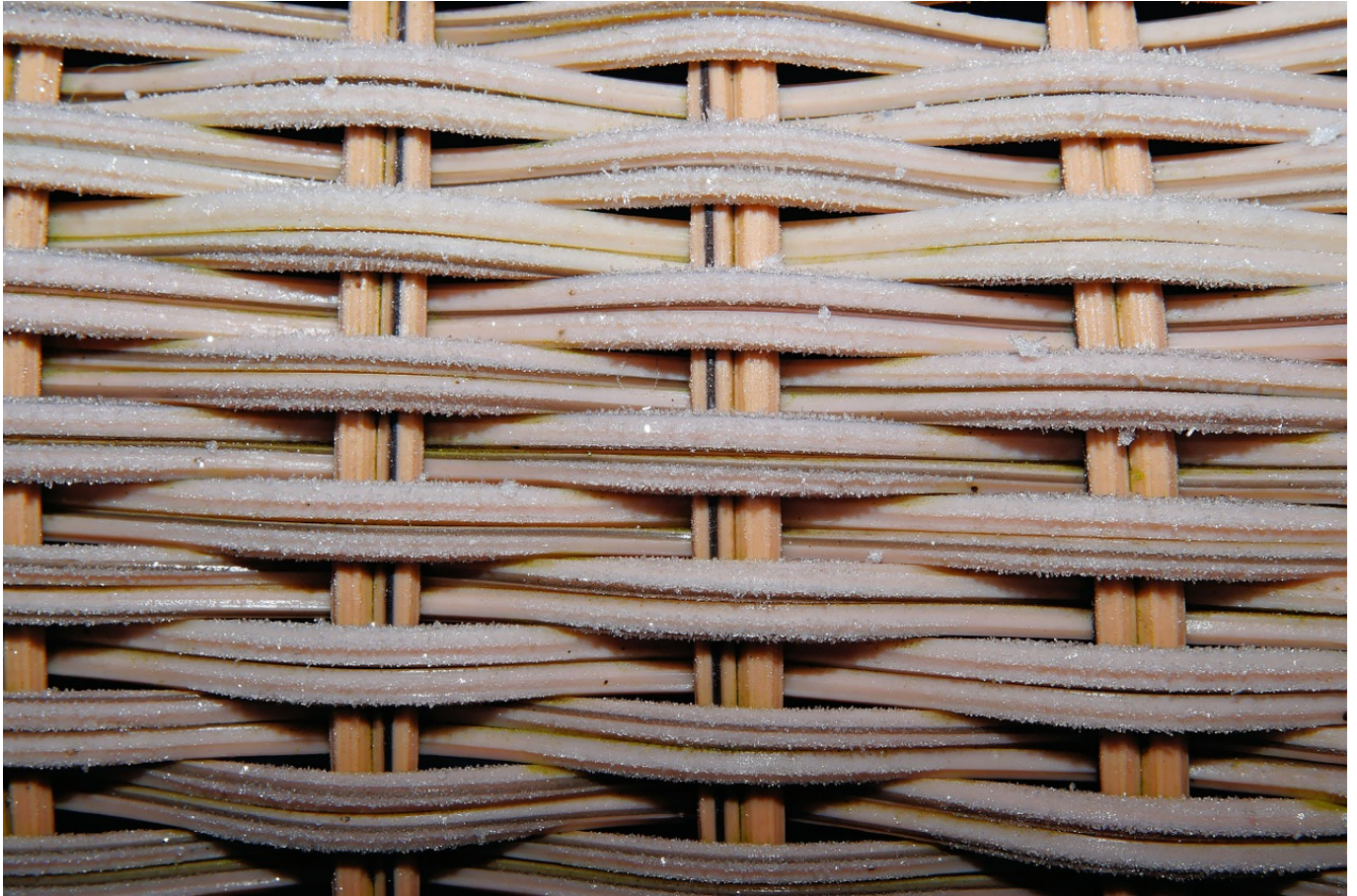
Synonyms of "Evenly" as an adverb (1 Word)

equally To the same degree (often followed by `as.
*Follow up discussion is **equally** important.*



Usage Examples of "Evenly" as an adverb

- *A series of evenly spaced dots.*
- *He speaks evenly and softly.*
- *Signals are numbered evenly, 2, 4, 6, 8, etc.*
- *A class evenly divided between girls and boys.*
- *He was breathing evenly, fast asleep.*
- *An evenly contested game.*
- *The match was evenly balanced throughout the first half.*
- *Scoop cream on to the cake and spread evenly.*
- *The jackpot will be split evenly among the holders of the three tickets.*



Associations of "Evenly" (30 Words)

analogous

(of organs) performing a similar function but having a different evolutionary origin, such as the wings of insects and birds.
*Brains and computers are often considered **analogous**.*

applicable

Capable of being applied; having relevance.
*The same considerations are equally **applicable** to accident claims.*

as

To the same degree often followed by as.
*Birds were singing and the child sang **as** sweetly.*

assuring

Giving confidence.

balanced

(of an electric circuit or signal) being symmetrical with respect to a reference point, usually earth.
*A **balanced** blend of whiskeys.*

commensurate

Corresponding in size or degree; in proportion.
*Salary will be **commensurate** with age and experience.*

comparable	Able to be compared or worthy of comparison. <i>Nobody is comparable with this athlete.</i>
consistently	In a fair and impartial way. <i>Students have to be treated consistently by all staff members.</i>
continued	Without a break in continuity; ongoing. <i>To insure the continued success of the war.</i>
equal	Be equal to in quality or ability. <i>Four plus six divided by two equals five.</i>
equally	In equal amounts or shares; in a balanced or impartial way. <i>The money can be divided equally between you.</i>
equilibrium	A stable situation in which forces cancel one another. <i>His intensity could unsettle his equilibrium.</i>
equipoise	A counterbalance or balancing force. <i>As a piece of language it is as delicately equipoised as any.</i>
equivalent	Being essentially equal to something. <i>A wish that was equivalent to a command.</i>
fair	Without favoring one party in a fair evenhanded manner. <i>An fair penny.</i>
identical	Exactly alike; incapable of being perceived as different. <i>The passage on the second floor was identical to the one below.</i>
importantly	In a manner designed to draw attention to one's importance. <i>More importantly Weber held that the manifold meaning attached to the event by the social scientist could alter his definition of the concrete event itself.</i>
indistinguishable	Exactly alike; incapable of being perceived as different. <i>The two specimens are actually different from each other but the differences are almost indistinguishable.</i>
liken	Consider or describe as similar, equal, or analogous. <i>Racism is likened to a contagious disease.</i>
parallel	Be parallel to. <i>The road runs parallel to the Ottawa River.</i>
proportionate	Agreeing in amount, magnitude, or degree. <i>Proportionate representation of a minority group.</i>
regularly	At uniform intervals of time. <i>Letters arrived regularly from his children.</i>
same	Same in identity. <i>They all wore the same clothes.</i>

similar	Having the same or similar characteristics. <i>Northern India and similar areas.</i>
<u>studied</u>	Produced or marked by conscious design or premeditation. <i>He treated them with studied politeness.</i>
symmetrical	Having similarity in size, shape, and relative position of corresponding parts. <i>The shape of a hill smooth and symmetrical.</i>
synonymous	(of words) meaning the same or nearly the same. <i>His deeds had made his name synonymous with victory.</i>
systematically	According to a fixed plan or system; methodically. <i>They systematically excluded women.</i>
<u>tantamount</u>	Equivalent in seriousness to; virtually the same as. <i>The resignations were tantamount to an admission of guilt.</i>
uniformly	In a way that is the same in all cases and at all times. <i>The performances are uniformly excellent.</i>
