Definitions of "Evenly" as an adverb

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "evenly" as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- In equal numbers, amounts, or values.
- Used to indicate a number that is divisible by two without a remainder.
- With equal space or time between each; regularly.
- In a level and regular way.
- With each having an equal chance.
- In equal amounts or shares; in a balanced or impartial way.
- Calmly and without strong emotion or variation.
- So as to present a flat or uniform surface or line.

equally To the same degree (often followed by `as. Follow up discussion is **equally** important.






Usage Examples of "Evenly" as an adverb

- A series of evenly spaced dots.
- He speaks evenly and softly.
- Signals are numbered evenly, 2, 4, 6, 8, etc.
- A class evenly divided between girls and boys.
- He was breathing evenly, fast asleep.
- An evenly contested game.
- The match was evenly balanced throughout the first half.
- Scoop cream on to the cake and spread evenly.
- The jackpot will be split evenly among the holders of the three tickets.





Associations of "Evenly" (30 Words)

commensurate Corresponding in size or degree; in proportion.

Salary will be **commensurate** with age and experience.



Able to be compared or worthy of comparison.

Nobody is **comparable** with this athlete.

consistently In a fair and impartial way.

Students have to be treated **consistently** by all staff members.

continued Without a break in continuity; ongoing.

To insure the **continued** success of the war.

equalBe equal to in quality or ability.

Four plus six divided by two **equal**s five.

equally

In equal amounts or shares; in a balanced or impartial way.

The money can be divided **equally** between you.

equilibrium A stable situation in which forces cancel one another.

His intensity could unsettle his **equilibrium**.

equipoise A counterbalance or balancing force.

As a piece of language it is as delicately **equipoise**d as any.

equivalent

Being essentially equal to something.

A wish that was **equivalent** to a command.

fair Without favoring one party in a fair evenhanded manner.

An **fair** penny.

identical Exactly alike; incapable of being perceived as different.

The passage on the second floor was **identical** to the one below.

In a manner designed to draw attention to one's importance.

importantly Weber held that the manifold meaning attached to

the event by the social scientist could alter his definition of the

concrete event itself.

Exactly alike; incapable of being perceived as different.

indistinguishable The two specimens are actually different from each other but the

differences are almost indistinguishable.

liken Consider or describe as similar, equal, or analogous.

Racism is **liken**ed to a contagious disease.

Be parallel to.

The road runs **parallel** to the Ottawa River.

proportionate Agreeing in amount, magnitude, or degree.

Proportionate representation of a minority group.

At uniform intervals of time.

regularly

Letters arrived regularly from his children.

Same in identity.

They all wore the **same** clothes.



similar Having the same or similar characteristics.

Northern India and **similar** areas.

studied Produced or marked by conscious design or premeditation.

He treated them with **studied** politeness.

Having similarity in size, shape, and relative position of corresponding

symmetrical parts.

The shape of a hill smooth and **symmetrical**.

synonymous (of words) meaning the same or nearly the same.

His deeds had made his name **synonymous** with victory.

systematically According to a fixed plan or system; methodically.

They **systematically** excluded women.

tantamount Equivalent in seriousness to; virtually the same as.

The resignations were **tantamount** to an admission of guilt.

uniformly

In a way that is the same in all cases and at all times.

The performances are **uniformly** excellent.
