## **Evenly as an Adverb**

### **Definitions of "Evenly" as an adverb**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “evenly” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *In equal numbers, amounts, or values.*
- *Used to indicate a number that is divisible by two without a remainder.*
- *With equal space or time between each; regularly.*
- *In a level and regular way.*
- *With each having an equal chance.*
- *In equal amounts or shares; in a balanced or impartial way.*
- *Calmly and without strong emotion or variation.*
- *So as to present a flat or uniform surface or line.*



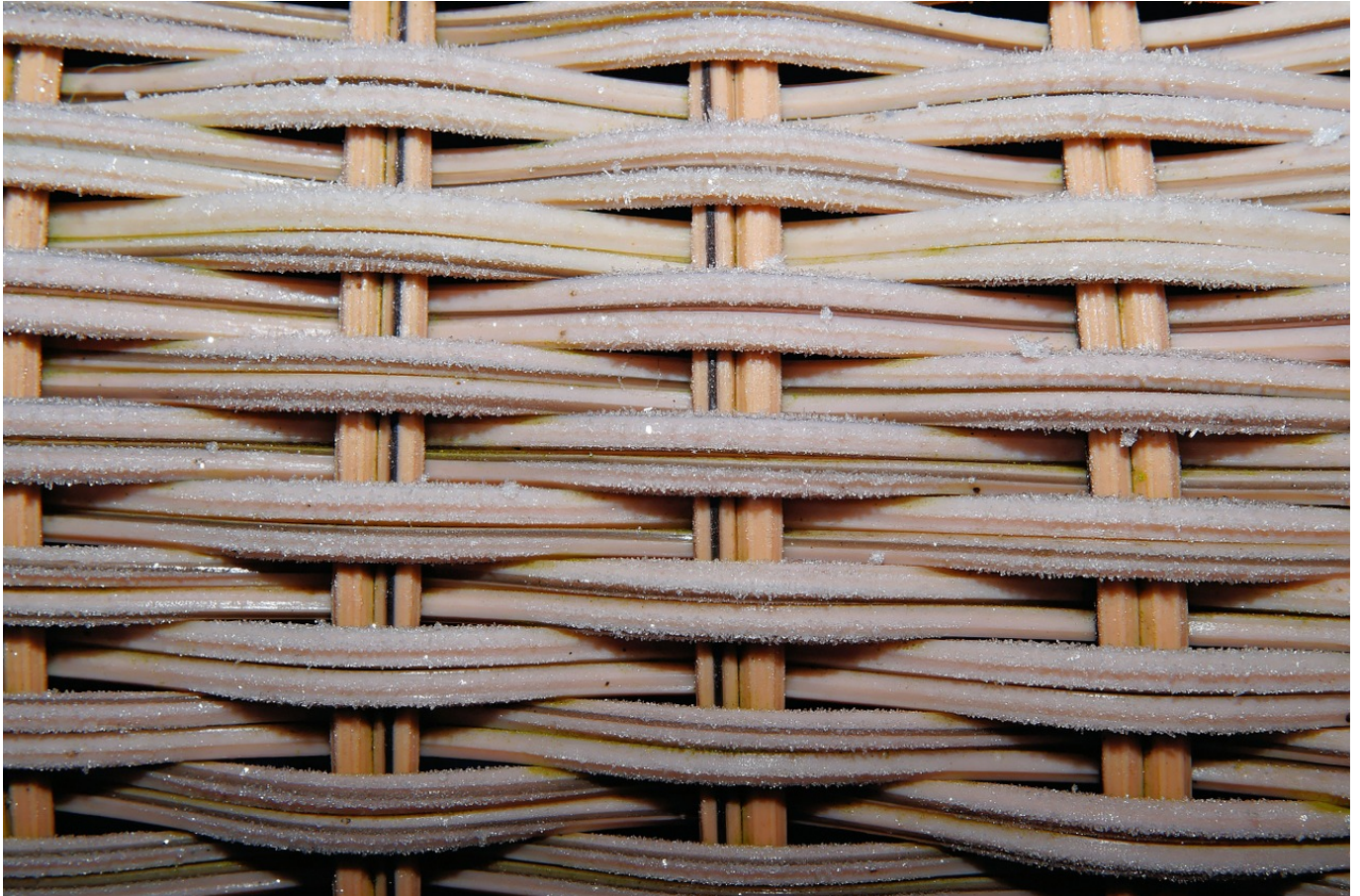
### **Synonyms of "Evenly" as an adverb (1 Word)**

**equally** To the same degree (often followed by `as.  
*Follow up discussion is **equally** important.*



## Usage Examples of "Evenly" as an adverb

- *A series of evenly spaced dots.*
- *He speaks evenly and softly.*
- *Signals are numbered evenly, 2, 4, 6, 8, etc.*
- *A class evenly divided between girls and boys.*
- *He was breathing evenly, fast asleep.*
- *An evenly contested game.*
- *The match was evenly balanced throughout the first half.*
- *Scoop cream on to the cake and spread evenly.*
- *The jackpot will be split evenly among the holders of the three tickets.*



## Associations of "Evenly" (30 Words)

### analogous

(of organs) performing a similar function but having a different evolutionary origin, such as the wings of insects and birds.  
*Brains and computers are often considered **analogous**.*

### **applicable**

Capable of being applied; having relevance.  
*The same considerations are equally **applicable** to accident claims.*

### **as**

To the same degree often followed by as.  
*Birds were singing and the child sang **as** sweetly.*

### assuring

Giving confidence.

### **balanced**

(of an electric circuit or signal) being symmetrical with respect to a reference point, usually earth.  
*A **balanced** blend of whiskeys.*

### commensurate

Corresponding in size or degree; in proportion.  
*Salary will be **commensurate** with age and experience.*

<b>comparable</b>	Able to be compared or worthy of comparison. <i>Nobody is <b>comparable</b> with this athlete.</i>
<b>consistently</b>	In a fair and impartial way. <i>Students have to be treated <b>consistently</b> by all staff members.</i>
<b>continued</b>	Without a break in continuity; ongoing. <i>To insure the <b>continued</b> success of the war.</i>
<b>equal</b>	Be equal to in quality or ability. <i>Four plus six divided by two <b>equals</b> five.</i>
<b>equally</b>	In equal amounts or shares; in a balanced or impartial way. <i>The money can be divided <b>equally</b> between you.</i>
<b>equilibrium</b>	A stable situation in which forces cancel one another. <i>His intensity could unsettle his <b>equilibrium</b>.</i>
<b>equipoise</b>	A counterbalance or balancing force. <i>As a piece of language it is as delicately <b>equipoised</b> as any.</i>
<b>equivalent</b>	Being essentially equal to something. <i>A wish that was <b>equivalent</b> to a command.</i>
<b>fair</b>	Without favoring one party in a fair evenhanded manner. <i>An <b>fair</b> penny.</i>
<b>identical</b>	Exactly alike; incapable of being perceived as different. <i>The passage on the second floor was <b>identical</b> to the one below.</i>
<b>importantly</b>	In a manner designed to draw attention to one's importance. <i>More <b>importantly</b> Weber held that the manifold meaning attached to the event by the social scientist could alter his definition of the concrete event itself.</i>
<b>indistinguishable</b>	Exactly alike; incapable of being perceived as different. <i>The two specimens are actually different from each other but the differences are almost <b>indistinguishable</b>.</i>
<b>liken</b>	Consider or describe as similar, equal, or analogous. <i>Racism is <b>likened</b> to a contagious disease.</i>
<b>parallel</b>	Be parallel to. <i>The road runs <b>parallel</b> to the Ottawa River.</i>
<b>proportionate</b>	Agreeing in amount, magnitude, or degree. <i><b>Proportionate</b> representation of a minority group.</i>
<b>regularly</b>	At uniform intervals of time. <i>Letters arrived <b>regularly</b> from his children.</i>
<b>same</b>	Same in identity. <i>They all wore the <b>same</b> clothes.</i>

<b>similar</b>	Having the same or similar characteristics. <i>Northern India and <b>similar</b> areas.</i>
<b><u>studied</u></b>	Produced or marked by conscious design or premeditation. <i>He treated them with <b>studied</b> politeness.</i>
<b>symmetrical</b>	Having similarity in size, shape, and relative position of corresponding parts. <i>The shape of a hill smooth and <b>symmetrical</b>.</i>
<b>synonymous</b>	(of words) meaning the same or nearly the same. <i>His deeds had made his name <b>synonymous</b> with victory.</i>
<b>systematically</b>	According to a fixed plan or system; methodically. <i>They <b>systematically</b> excluded women.</i>
<b><u>tantamount</u></b>	Equivalent in seriousness to; virtually the same as. <i>The resignations were <b>tantamount</b> to an admission of guilt.</i>
<b>uniformly</b>	In a way that is the same in all cases and at all times. <i>The performances are <b>uniformly</b> excellent.</i>
