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Associations of "Ever so often" (30 Words)

always	At all times; all the time and on every occasion. <i>Isabel had always been in rude health.</i>
constantly	Without variation or change, in every case. <i>He was constantly on her mind.</i>
<u>continually</u>	Without interruption; constantly. <i>I was continually moving around.</i>
continuously	With unflagging resolve. <i>Their performance has continuously improved.</i>
<u>dabble</u>	Play in or as if in water, as of small children. <i>Teal dabble in the shallows.</i>
<u>every</u>	Each and all of a series of entities or intervals as specified. <i>Every two hours.</i>
<u>forever</u>	A very long time (used hyperbolically). <i>Parenting is a forever job.</i>
<u>frequency</u>	The number of occurrences within a given time period. <i>The frequency of his seizures increased as he grew older.</i>
<u>frequent</u>	Be a regular or frequent visitor to a certain place. <i>A frequent or common error is using the transitive verb lay for the intransitive lie.</i>
<u>frequently</u>	Regularly or habitually; often. <i>They go abroad frequently.</i>
<u>incidence</u>	The striking of a light beam on a surface. <i>The point of incidence of the beam.</i>
infrequently	Not often; rarely. <i>He cooks but only infrequently.</i>
intermittently	At irregular intervals; not continuously or steadily. <i>An intermittently amusing plot.</i>

<u>invariably</u>	In every case or on every occasion; always. <i>Ranch meals are invariably big and hearty.</i>
modulated	Altered in volume as well as tone or pitch.
occasional	Employed for a particular occasion or on an irregular basis. <i>An occasional worker.</i>
<u>occasionally</u>	Sporadically and infrequently. <i>He was arrogant and occasionally callous.</i>
oft	Many times at short intervals. <i>An oft quoted tenet.</i>
oftentimes	Many times at short intervals. <i>I would oftentimes go there.</i>
perpetual	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>The perpetual struggle to maintain standards in a democracy.</i>
<u>rare</u>	Marked by an uncommon quality; especially superlative or extreme of its kind. <i>Rare roast beef.</i>
<u>rarely</u>	Not often. <i>The rarely fine Sheraton bookcase.</i>
rareness	Noteworthy scarcity.
<u>recidivism</u>	Habitual relapse into crime. <i>The prison has succeeded in reducing recidivism.</i>
<u>recurrent</u>	Recurring again and again. <i>She had a recurrent dream about falling.</i>
<u>sometimes</u>	Occasionally, rather than all of the time. <i>Sometimes I want to do things on my own.</i>
<u>sparse</u>	Thinly dispersed or scattered. <i>Information on earnings is sparse.</i>
sporadically	Occasionally or at irregular intervals. <i>He only works sporadically.</i>
successively	Immediately one after another. <i>Three letters of successively decreasing length.</i>
unceasingly	With unflagging resolve.
