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## Associations of "Ever so often" (30 Words)

<b>always</b>	At all times; all the time and on every occasion. <i>Isabel had <b>always</b> been in rude health.</i>
<b>constantly</b>	Without variation or change, in every case. <i>He was <b>constantly</b> on her mind.</i>
<a href="#"><u>continually</u></a>	Without interruption; constantly. <i>I was <b>continually</b> moving around.</i>
<b>continuously</b>	With unflagging resolve. <i>Their performance has <b>continuously</b> improved.</i>
<a href="#"><u>dabble</u></a>	Play in or as if in water, as of small children. <i>Teal <b>dabble</b> in the shallows.</i>
<a href="#"><u>every</u></a>	Each and all of a series of entities or intervals as specified. <i><b>Every</b> two hours.</i>
<a href="#"><u>forever</u></a>	A very long time (used hyperbolically). <i>Parenting is a <b>forever</b> job.</i>
<a href="#"><u>frequency</u></a>	The number of occurrences within a given time period. <i>The <b>frequency</b> of his seizures increased as he grew older.</i>
<a href="#"><u>frequent</u></a>	Be a regular or frequent visitor to a certain place. <i>A <b>frequent</b> or common error is using the transitive verb lay for the intransitive lie.</i>
<a href="#"><u>frequently</u></a>	Regularly or habitually; often. <i>They go abroad <b>frequently</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>incidence</u></a>	The striking of a light beam on a surface. <i>The point of <b>incidence</b> of the beam.</i>
<b>infrequently</b>	Not often; rarely. <i>He cooks but only <b>infrequently</b>.</i>
<b>intermittently</b>	At irregular intervals; not continuously or steadily. <i>An <b>intermittently</b> amusing plot.</i>

<b><u>invariably</u></b>	In every case or on every occasion; always. <i>Ranch meals are <b>invariably</b> big and hearty.</i>
<b>modulated</b>	Altered in volume as well as tone or pitch.
<b>occasional</b>	Employed for a particular occasion or on an irregular basis. <i>An <b>occasional</b> worker.</i>
<b><u>occasionally</u></b>	Sporadically and infrequently. <i>He was arrogant and <b>occasionally</b> callous.</i>
<b>oft</b>	Many times at short intervals. <i>An <b>oft</b> quoted tenet.</i>
<b>oftentimes</b>	Many times at short intervals. <i>I would <b>oftentimes</b> go there.</i>
<b>perpetual</b>	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>The <b>perpetual</b> struggle to maintain standards in a democracy.</i>
<b><u>rare</u></b>	Marked by an uncommon quality; especially superlative or extreme of its kind. <i><b>Rare</b> roast beef.</i>
<b><u>rarely</u></b>	Not often. <i>The <b>rarely</b> fine Sheraton bookcase.</i>
<b>rareness</b>	Noteworthy scarcity.
<b><u>recidivism</u></b>	Habitual relapse into crime. <i>The prison has succeeded in reducing <b>recidivism</b>.</i>
<b><u>recurrent</u></b>	Recurring again and again. <i>She had a <b>recurrent</b> dream about falling.</i>
<b><u>sometimes</u></b>	Occasionally, rather than all of the time. <i><b>Sometimes</b> I want to do things on my own.</i>
<b><u>sparse</u></b>	Thinly dispersed or scattered. <i>Information on earnings is <b>sparse</b>.</i>
<b>sporadically</b>	Occasionally or at irregular intervals. <i>He only works <b>sporadically</b>.</i>
<b>successively</b>	Immediately one after another. <i>Three letters of <b>successively</b> decreasing length.</i>
<b>unceasingly</b>	With unflagging resolve.
