always	At all times; all the time and on every occasion. Isabel had always been in rude health.
constantly	Without variation or change, in every case. <i>He was constantly on her mind</i> .
<u>continually</u>	Without interruption; constantly. I was continually moving around.
continuously	With unflagging resolve. Their performance has continuously improved.
<u>dabble</u>	Play in or as if in water, as of small children. <i>Teal dabble in the shallows.</i>
<u>every</u>	Each and all of a series of entities or intervals as specified. <i>Every two hours.</i>
<u>forever</u>	A very long time (used hyperbolically. Parenting is a forever job.
<u>frequency</u>	The number of occurrences within a given time period. The frequency of his seizures increased as he grew older.
<u>frequent</u>	Be a regular or frequent visitor to a certain place. A frequent or common error is using the transitive verb lay for the intransitive lie.
<u>frequently</u>	Regularly or habitually; often. They go abroad frequently .
<u>incidence</u>	The striking of a light beam on a surface. The point of incidence of the beam.
infrequently	Not often; rarely. <i>He cooks but only infrequently.</i>
intermittently	At irregular intervals; not continuously or steadily. An intermittently amusing plot.



<u>invariably</u>	In every case or on every occasion; always. Ranch meals are invariably big and hearty.
modulated	Altered in volume as well as tone or pitch.
occasional	Employed for a particular occasion or on an irregular basis. An occasional worker.
occasionally	Sporadically and infrequently. <i>He was arrogant and occasionally callous.</i>
oft	Many times at short intervals. An oft quoted tenet.
oftentimes	Many times at short intervals. I would oftentimes go there.
perpetual	Continuing forever or indefinitely. The perpetual struggle to maintain standards in a democracy.
<u>rare</u>	Marked by an uncommon quality; especially superlative or extreme of its kind. <i>Rare</i> roast beef.
<u>rarely</u>	Not often. The rarely fine Sheraton bookcase.
rareness	Noteworthy scarcity.
<u>recidivism</u>	Habitual relapse into crime. The prison has succeeded in reducing recidivism .
<u>recurrent</u>	Recurring again and again. She had a recurrent dream about falling.
<u>sometimes</u>	Occasionally, rather than all of the time. Sometimes I want to do things on my own.
<u>sparse</u>	Thinly dispersed or scattered. Information on earnings is sparse .
sporadically	Occasionally or at irregular intervals. <i>He only works sporadically.</i>
successively	Immediately one after another. Three letters of successively decreasing length.
unceasingly	With unflagging resolve.
