## Ever as an Adverb

### Definitions of "Ever" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “ever” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *(intensifier for adjectives) very.*
- *Very.*
- *Used for emphasis in questions expressing astonishment or outrage.*
- *Increasingly; constantly.*
- *Used in comparisons for emphasis.*
- *At all times; all the time and on every occasion.*
- *At all times; always.*
- *At any time.*



## Synonyms of "Ever" as an adverb (18 Words)

**always**

As a last resort; failing all else.  
***Always** arrives on time.*

**constantly**

Continuously over a period of time; always.  
*The world is **constantly** changing.*

**continually**

Repeated frequently in the same way; regularly.  
*I was **continually** moving around.*

**e'er**

At all times; all the time and on every occasion.

**endlessly**

In a way that has or seems to have no end or limit.  
*The original episodes were **endlessly** repeated.*

**eternally**

In a way that continues or lasts forever; permanently.  
*He was prattling on **eternally**.*

**ever so**

Very.

<b>forever</b>	For all future time; for always. <i>No one can live <b>forever</b>.</i>
<b>in any way</b>	To or toward the inside of.
<b>incessantly</b>	Without interruption; constantly. <i>She talked about him <b>incessantly</b>.</i>
<b>invariably</b>	Without variation or change, in every case. <i>Ranch meals are <b>invariably</b> big and hearty.</i>
<b>of all time</b>	To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent (‘whole’ is often used informally for ‘wholly’).
<b>perennially</b>	In a way that continues for a long or apparently infinite time; permanently. <i>A new blow to the <b>perennially</b> struggling economy.</i>
<b>perpetually</b>	In a way that never ends or changes; constantly. <i>She seems <b>perpetually</b> to have a mournful look on her face.</i>
<b>persistently</b>	In a persistent manner; continuously. <i>The rules are <b>persistently</b> flouted.</i>
<b>repeatedly</b>	Over and over again; constantly. <i>They have been warned <b>repeatedly</b> with no effect.</i>
<b>unceasingly</b>	With unflagging resolve.
<b>under any circumstances</b>	Into unconsciousness.

<b><u>ceaseless</u></b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The fort was subjected to <b>ceaseless</b> bombardment.</i>
<b>changeless</b>	Unvarying in nature. <i><b>Changeless</b> truths.</i>
<b>constant</b>	(of a person) unchangingly faithful and dependable. <i><b>Constant</b> as the northern star.</i>
<b>constantly</b>	Without variation or change, in every case. <i>The world is <b>constantly</b> changing.</i>
<b><u>continually</u></b>	Repeated frequently in the same way; regularly. <i>I was <b>continually</b> moving around.</i>

<b>continue</b>	Continue talking he continued. <i>The Archive has <b>continued</b> its programme of research.</i>
<b>continued</b>	Without a break in continuity; ongoing. <i>The <b>continued</b> existence of nationalism.</i>
<b>continuous</b>	Continuing in time or space without interruption- James Jeans. <i>There are <b>continuous</b> advances in design and production.</i>
<b>continuously</b>	At every point. <i>These images loop <b>continuously</b>.</i>
<b>endless</b>	Having or seeming to have no end or limit. <i><b>Endless</b> waves.</i>
<b>eternal</b>	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>She is an <b>eternal</b> optimist.</i>
<b>everlasting</b>	Any of various plants of various genera of the family Compositae having flowers that can be dried without loss of form or color. <i>Life <b>everlasting</b>.</i>
<b>every</b>	(used of count nouns) each and all of the members of a group considered singly and without exception. <i>Had <b>every</b> hope of success.</i>
<b>forever</b>	Used in slogans of support after the name of something or someone. <i>It took <b>forever</b> to get a passport.</i>
<b>grinding</b>	A harsh and strident sound as of the grinding of gears. <i>The <b>grinding</b> roar of the lorries.</i>
<b>incessant</b>	(of something regarded as unpleasant) continuing without pause or interruption. <i>Night and day we live with the <b>incessant</b> noise of the city.</i>
<b>incessantly</b>	Without interruption. <i>She talked about him <b>incessantly</b>.</i>
<b>interminable</b>	Endless or apparently endless (often used hyperbolically). <i>We got bogged down in <b>interminable</b> discussions.</i>
<b>invariably</b>	In every case or on every occasion; always. <i>Ranch meals are <b>invariably</b> big and hearty.</i>
<b>occasionally</b>	Sporadically and infrequently. <i>Open areas are only <b>occasionally</b> interrupted by clumps of trees.</i>
<b>permanent</b>	Not capable of being reversed or returned to the original condition. <i>A woman with a home <b>permanent</b>.</i>
<b>perpetual</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Hell s <b>perpetual</b> fires.</i>



<b>perpetually</b>	In a way that never ends or changes; constantly. <i><b>Perpetually</b> hungry teenage boys.</i>
<b>persistent</b>	Continuing firmly or obstinately in an opinion or course of action in spite of difficulty or opposition. <i>The <b>persistent</b> gills of fishes.</i>
<b>successively</b>	Immediately one after another. <i>Three letters of <b>successively</b> decreasing length.</i>
<b>unceasing</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The <b>unceasing</b> efforts of the staff.</i>
<b>unceasingly</b>	With unflagging resolve.
<b>unchecked</b>	Not examined or checked. <i>Prices rose <b>unchecked</b> hitting the poor worst of all.</i>
<b>unlimited</b>	That cannot be entirely consumed or used up. <i>Offshore reserves of gas and oil are not <b>unlimited</b>.</i>
