Regularly or habitually; often. **frequently** They go abroad **frequently**.

Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. incessant

Night and day we live with the **incessant** noise of the city.

Without interruption.

incessantly She talked about him **incessantly**.

Continuing forever without end. infinitely

There are issues here that could be expanded **infinitely**.

In every case or on every occasion; always. **invariably**

Ranch meals are **invariably** big and hearty.

Of elongated shape. long

The Cambridge side played the ball **long**.

Slightly short of or not quite accomplished; all but. nearly

At infrequent or irregular intervals; now and then. **occasionally**
